RSI, Inc Begins Move to New Kyle Facility

The eagerly awaited relocation of RSI, Inc., (Response-Service-Innovation), into its new 40,000 sq/ft facility at 1670 Kohler's Crossing in Kyle began on Saturday Dec 15th and should be concluded by the end of 2007. RSI, located just north of the HEB Plus and Kyle Marketplace Shopping Center, will be bringing more than 100 engineering, manufacturing, management, and support jobs to the community. The company's business is expected to rapidly expand as their larger, more modern facility will be able to accommodate much greater demand for RSI's specialized technology.

CRI (Computer Ruggedization and Integration), a division of RSI and a leading provider of rugged electronic equipment, will be relocating to the company's Kyle based corporate headquarters along with RSI's cable harnessing, gasket manufacturing, and value-added divisions. RSI's distribution warehouse will remain in Pflugerville.

RSI is a leader in electrical interconnect distribution and electronics ruggedization and is at the leading edge of what is anticipated to be a growing trend of manufacturers moving from more urban locations to the welcoming arms of growing, smaller communities.

RSI and the City of Kyle reached a unique agreement in October of 2006 that centers on RSI bringing as many as 200 jobs into the City of Kyle over the next five years. In turn, the City

of Kyle will reimburse RSI, Inc. for their land purchase based on the number of jobs created and retained.

“RSI is exactly the type of business we want to have in Kyle, not only for their positive economic impact, but for the high level, professional career opportunities they bring to our citizens,” said Kyle City Manager Tom Mattis. “We are very excited to have a company with the community values and commitment to quality that RSI brings to our employment base.”

Little-Noack designed RSI’s new facility with Structura, Inc. serving as the general contractor. This extraordinary team transformed raw land to a fully operational state-of-the-art production facility in just five months. In January 2008, new ruggedized wireless routers for heavy equipment manufacturers and commercial transportation entities, ruggedized servers and displays for defense customers worldwide, and electro-mechanical assemblies, cable harnesses, integrated racks for oil exploration companies will be built and shipped out as the first products manufactured in Kyle.
