Iconic downtown water tower repairs complete

As part of the City of Kyle's water tank rehabilitation program, city leaders unveiled the newly painted downtown water tower this week. Rather than the traditional red, white and blue that has adorned the tower for decades, staff decided to go a different direction.

Reactions from Kyle residents ranged from surprise to shock to utter disbelief as they watched the tarp being removed from the tank Friday morning.

Mayor Warren Peace said he hopes Kyle-ites understand the reason for the change of design on the water tower.

"There is so much negativity these days, we want the tower to be a symbol of happiness and positivity for the city," he said.

Council member Justin Case, who spoke after the unveiling said, "This yellow happy face reminds us all that while stuff happens, how we choose to react is what matters."

Motorcycle Chute Out


Law enforcement agencies from across the country will converge at the **Capital of Texas Police Motorcycle Chute Out** April 1-2 at Cabela's in Buda.
