Kyle moves to Stage 2 of water conservation plan

The city of Kyle is now in Stage 2 of its water conservation plan. Several factors contributed to the city's decision to bump up its conservation efforts. According to Kyle Utility Coordinator Jason Biemer, the drought steadily continues even as demand, defined as water consumption, is on the rise.

"Customer demand is 33 percent higher than during the same period in 2014," he said.

He said past experience with

conservation efforts indicate it will take approximately six weeks to get Kyle water customers back on track for conservation under Stage 2.

Kyle now is Stage 2 of Water Conservation Plan

"On the plus side, residents understand water conservation much better than they did even four or five years ago," Biemer said. "That being said, we need to start that move now to

ensure we're able to meet our long-term obligations."

Public Works Director Harper Wilder said, "The message is out there and Kyle water

customers understand why these stages exist. It's this city-wide effort that allows Kyle to continue

to be good stewards of our water supply."

Biemer said he will recommend staying at Stage 2 until conditions warrant otherwise.
