Marketplace Ave. Groundbreaking

The first of five major road projects approved by Kyle voters in 2013 kicked off Wednesday morning with a ceremonial groundbreaking.

Work contractually began on the Marketplace Ave. extension Sept. 8, and progress is already evident.

On Wednesday, Kyle city officials, council members and a member of the city's Mobility Committee joined the landowner, Ray Parker, the developer, Joe Brooks, and representatives of the construction and engineering firms to celebrate the project launch.

The extension, a roughly 3/4 of a mile section of road, will connect Marketplace Ave. (at City Lights Dr.) with N. Burleson St. Construction will cost \$3.8 million and take about 300 days to complete. This will make travel to downtown Kyle easier.

Road Repairs 101

Residents in Hometown Kyle and Amberwood probably saw road crews in their neighborhoods this week. It's part of the city's road maintenance program.

Viking Construction did microsurfacing on two roads: Amberwood South and



Hometown Kyle Parkway.

Microsurfacing uses a mixture of water, oil, rock and cement. That mix is laid down with special equipment and typically dries within a few hours.

Some people asked, "Why now? Our roads look fine."

Road maintenance is a bit like getting regular tune ups on a vehicle. Go too long without one, and things are harder - and more expensive - to fix.

Microsurfacing is a less expensive way to extend road life about 7-8 more years. At about

\$3.32 sq. yard, it's more affordable than the cost to completely repair a roadway, which can cost about \$150/sq. yard. Wowza!

Founders Day Parade
