FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter of an ethics complaint filed by John Ferrara against Jeffery Barnett on July 6, 2020, stayed on August 12, 2020 and resumed on January 28, 2022, was considered by the City of Kyle Ethics Commission on March 23, 2022 during a public meeting of the Commission. The Commission, after considering the evidence submitted by the complainant and any responses from the accused, voted to dismiss the complaint with prejudice. Pursuant to its duty under the City of Kyle Municipal Code of Ordinances, Sec. 2-278(a), the Commission hereby issues these findings of fact and conclusions of law:

I. Findings of Fact.

The City of Kyle Ethics Commission finds that the alleged complaint against Jeffery Barnett includes allegations that lack merit or are not within the jurisdiction of the Ethics Commission.

Conclusions of Law. II.

The City of Kyle Ethics Commission concludes that a complaint which contains allegations that lack merit or are not within the jurisdiction of the Commission must be dismissed with prejudice.

III. Order.

The Complaint by John Ferrara against Jeffery Barnett is hereby dismissed with prejudice. SO ORDERED, this 23rd day of March 2022.
