ETHICS COMPLAINT

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter of an ethics complaint filed by Yvonne Flores-Cale against Scott Sellers on May 17, 2022 (part one of two), was considered by the City of Kyle Ethics Commission on June 23, 2022 during a public meeting of the Commission. The Commission, after considering the evidence submitted by the complainant and any responses from the accused, voted to dismiss the complaint without prejudice. Pursuant to its duty under the City of Kyle Municipal Code of Ordinances, Sec. 2-278(a), the Commission hereby issues these findings of fact and conclusions of law:

I. Findings of Fact.

The City of Kyle Ethics Commission finds that the alleged complaints against Scott Sellers are premature and not yet ripe for the Commission to open an investigation and begin hearings. However, the Commission recognizes that there is potential for an ethics violation to occur.


Further, the Commission recommends that the City Council reconsider whether to allow its City Manager to engage in a consulting business.

II. Conclusions of Law.


The City of Kyle Ethics Commission concludes that a complaint which is not yet ripe must be dismissed without prejudice.

III. Order.

The Complaint by Yvonne Flores-Cale against Scott Sellers is hereby dismissed without prejudice. SO ORDERED, this 23rd day of June 2022.
