
### **City Council Applications**

# KPD begins new warrant program

Kyle City Council approved moving forward with new technology that will assist the Kyle Police Department in finding individuals who have outstanding warrants.

Those unpaid warrants currently total \$4.8

million. A portion of that money goes to the state. KPD will soon implement new technology that aims to help recoup some of those funds.

The system allows law enforcement vehicles to scan licenses plates on vehicles on public roadways and spaces, which will then let officers know if they find a match.

This new program should be up and running in the next few months.

# **Kyle Road Bond Updates**

A question we hear at City Hall every so often is, "What's happening with the 2013 Kyle road bond program?" We're glad you asked! Many don't realize all the steps and puzzle pieces involved in getting roads built or upgraded.

Behind the scenes, city staff handle right-of-way acquisition, review

plans and work with utility companies on moving lines, just to name a few tasks. It can take months or longer to finalize all the moving parts.

# Kyle PD now offers 'Safe Trade' locale

The Kyle Police Department (KPD) is now offering its headquarters as a meeting place for online sales transactions to take place.

Called Safe Trade, the program provides a safe, welllit and video monitored location for people to pick up items they purchased online or receive payment for items they sold.

Parking lots and other public locations are often used when two parties meet to trade money for

"The KPD headquarters is just another option for Kyle residents who utilize services such as Craigslist," KPD Chief Jeff Barnett said.

Since the lobby of the KPD police station is open 24/7, Safe Trade transactions can take place at most any time of day.

There is no need to call ahead or make any kind of reservation; simply tell the other party to meet you at 111 N. Front Street in Kyle, inside the lobby.

For larger, heavier items, including furniture and bikes, the KPD parking lot in front of the station is also available to make safe trades.

# **Kyle Depot soft opening**

The restored Kyle Depot — the old train station on Front Street, across from City Hall - is nearing completion.

A joint venture with the City of Kyle and the Hays County Historical Commission, the project has been going on for about 13 years. The result is a beautiully restored building that will serve as a museum and history center for Kyle.

We welcome Kyle residents to join us from 10noon on Jan. 23 for a look into the city's historic past.

At this "soft" opening, author Betty Harrison will be on hand with her new book, "Images of America: Kyle." A documentary film will also play during the event.
