Clearing up compost confusion

Kyle offers composting as part of its trash pickup program with Texas Disposal Systems (TDS).

As a result of its efforts, TDS has prevented tons of waste from getting into landfills through recycling and composting efforts.

Recently, some items that aren't compostable have shown up in Kyle customer's bins. What kinds



of things? Cardboard, plastic, milk jugs — all items that don't belong in your City of Kyle compost bin.

Having noncompostable items in the bins could cause TDS to begin charging customers more money. It's also not great for the environment since that material has to go in the landfill.

Another issue is some compostapproved items are showing up at TDS inside plastic bags. But once items are placed in a plastic bag, they are considered trash and therefore no longer compostable.

Compost Tips

DO compost these items: Lawn /grass clippings Leaves, tree limbs Paper towels, napkins Pizza boxes

DON'T compost these items: Food items of any kind Cardboard (e.g., used for shipping) Plastic bags

The next logical question is, of course, what is compostable through Texas Disposal Systems?

Great question, we're glad you asked! See Compost Tips above for items that are – and are not – meant to be in your compost bin.

With a few simple changes around your home, you can help ID trash, recycling and compost like a pro. That will help TDS protect our environment and keep costs down.
