*Drive Thru: Located in alley between City Hall and Dark Horse. Phone: Call us at

512-262-3960. Note, only Visa, Discover and Mastercard are accepted by telephone.

After Hours: Night Drop located in the Drive Thru, check or money order only. *Must include* payment coupon

Auto pay: 1. ACH Drafting; probably the easiest payment method.

2. Credit Card Drafting: (Visa, Mastercard and Discover); recurring credit card payments are processed on the 10th of each month.
