Be Sewer Savvy

Part II: Bogged down with FOG (fats, oils and grease)

Thanksgiving is almost here! Wait. How is that related to the sewer? Good question!

Residents and homeowners use grease for cooking. Frying turkeys is quite common at this time of year. What happens with that used grease is important to all of us in Kyle.

Disposing of all kinds of fats, oils and grease (FOG) correctly can be the difference between a healthy sewer system and one that costs more to maintain.

Because FOG doesn't break up, it can begin to cling to and clog pipes similar to how cholesterol causes blockages in arteries.

Clogged pipes don't allow water to flow through as quickly, plus other materials such as toilet paper, wipes and feminine items can add to the blockage.

This could result in

overflowing sewers, which has happened on occasion. Another issue is that FOG ends up in lift stations and at the water treatment plant, which then has to be cleaned.

By disposing of grease in the trash or through a restaurant recycling program, much of the issue can be avoided before that grease has a chance to cause problems.
