### II. QUAIL RIDGE/LIMESTONE CREEK UPDATE

As of August 1, 2023, all 5 property owners of the 6 lots in Quail Ridge that will be affected by the extension of South Goforth Road have been contacted and have granted permission for Right of Entry. This will allow surveyors to access the properties. Appraisers are currently working to schedule inspections. Once surveys and inspections are completed, Stateside ROW will look at comparable properties on the market and provide recommendations. The preliminary plans for the construction of Goforth Road have been submitted to the City and are currently in review.

## IV. CITY OF KYLE WATER USAGE

The table below outlines the City's water usage, in gallons, for the year to date as of August 2023. This is broken down for each of the City of Kyle's 3 water suppliers and identifies our usage for the year compared to our total allocated amount per year from each supplier. As of August 8, 2023, we are 67% through the calendar year, and we have used ~71% of the EAA water, ~41% of the BSCEAD water, and ~51% of the GBRA water. We have used ~51% of our total annual allocation during the same time period.City Staff are watching our water usage closely to make sure we are not going over our permits, and want to be transparent with the Council and public on the metrics we use to track these limits.

The team also filled holes along Windy Hill Road to make grass even for easy mowing.







