## II. SECURITY AT PUBLIC SAFETY CENTER

Persons coming through the front door needing interaction with the police department personnel can request that assistance from the PD staff person at the window. If that person has a personal matter to discuss, they will be escorted to a private interview room away from the PSC lobby. We will be placing signage in the PSC lobby to direct persons coming to meet with city administrative staff directing them to the upstairs reception area.

### III. CITY OF KYLE WATER USAGE

Staff Contact: Amber Schmeits

The City of Kyle is currently under Amended Stage 2 Mandatory Water Use Management Rules. During this time, we are asking residents to do their part to conserve and reduce water use as much as possible and abide by the Amended Stage 2 Drought restrictions that are listed at [CityofKyle.com/Drought](http://CityofKyle.com/Drought).

Kyle, like many cities throughout Central Texas, is working to manage the historic drought conditions in this region. But if drought conditions continue and our water providers go into stricter restrictions, the city will need to further tighten our drought restrictions.

City Staff is continuing to monitor the situation. Currently, the Edwards Aquifer Authority (EAA) is in Stage IV Drought Restrictions, the Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority (GBRA) is under voluntary reductions of 5%, and the Barton Springs Edwards Aquifer Conservation District (BSEACD) is in Stage III Drought Restrictions. According to the website for BSEACD, the Barton Springs gage is reporting discharge below the Stage IV threshold, but BSEACD is still in Stage III. It is unknown whether the BSEACD will move to Stage IV Drought Restrictions in September, but the city staff is paying close attention to their status in an effort to respond appropriately. According to the NOAA precipitation data, Kyle has received only 10-25% of the Normal Precipitation for our area as of July 2023.

The table below outlines the City's water usage, in gallons, for the year to date, as of August 2023. This is broken down for each of the City of Kyle's 3 water suppliers and identifies our usage for the year compared to our total allocated amount per year from each supplier. City Staff is watching our water usage closely to make sure we are not going over our permits, and want to be transparent with the Council and public on the metrics we use to track these limits.

In addition to monitoring conservation district permit allocations Kyle Staff are continuously monitoring system demands throughout the water system. If current demands persist further restrictions will be required in order to lower peak demands that we are witnessing throughout the system. The City Council will have a special meeting on Tuesday, September 5 at 5:30 p.m. to receive a report on and discuss the city's water usage and drought restrictions.

## CITY OF KYLE WATER USAGE CONTINUED

The City of Kyle is ramping up enforcement efforts for the current watering restrictions. Future violations may result in citations and fines. We are asking for all residents and businesses to do their part so that all of us may have access to our most precious resource. The City has invested heavily in expanding our water infrastructure as well as increasing our water supply for the future. To date that investment is just over \$51 million in investments in the water system with millions more in future capital improvement projects. As the demand for water in Central Texas increases with a booming population, the City of Kyle has also partnered with Alliance Water to plan for and provide long-term water solutions.
