II. CITY PREPARES FOR WINTER WEATHER

According to the National Weather Service, a storm system will move through the region late Thursday into Friday, likely bringing with it isolated thunderstorms and strong wind gusts. Freezing temperatures will begin Sunday night leading into Monday and Tuesday. National Weather Service expects the low temps on Monday and Tuesday mornings to be in the high teens, with a possible single digit real feel, if there is wind chill. City crews are getting ready by loading trucks with sand for the roadways, testing and topping off all generators with fuel and anti-gelling agent, fueling trucks and equipment and preparing on-call crews.

The City is prepared to activate the Krug Activity Center, 101 S. Burleson Street, and the Kyle Public Library, 550 Scott Street, to serve as warming centers, in the event of power outages. The City is also working with Hays County Office of Emergency Services to be ready to activate County Shelters in the event of prolonged widespread power outages. Residents are advised to take steps now to make sure your family and home are prepared for prolonged freezing temperatures and the many challenges — power failures, frozen pipes, closed roads, etc. — that it can bring.

- Review your emergency & communication plans with your family.
- Create an emergency supply kit with non-perishable foods, water, pet supplies, medications, & other essentials.
- Wrap exposed faucets & pipes.
- Insulate your outdoor water meter box & be sure its lid is on tight.
- Cover any vents around your home's foundation.
- Bring any pets indoors.
- Prepare outdoor livestock/animals for freezing conditions.
- Bring in potted plants & cover outdoor plants.
- Drip faucets when temps fall below freezing (5 drips per minute, not a stream).
- Check current road conditions and closures at drivetexas.org before you leave the house.




