III. INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECT UPDATES

Goforth Road Update:

- Paving Completed to Date 2,710 LF
- Remaining- 3,115 LF
- Completion Estimated by Mid-June
- No Major Issues to Report. The project is progressing as planned.





Cypress Road Repair Work:

- Due to the wastewater upgrades currently underway on Old Stagecoach Rd, some traffic has been detoured through Cypress Forest highlighting several deficiencies with Cypress Forrest Rd. In response, Street Maintenance Crews quickly mobilized to address issues that have been reported.
- To date, Maintenance Crews have repaired
 44 potholes and 150LF of shoulder.
- Crews monitor the area daily and complete emergency repairs as warranted.

Pothole Repair Tracker:

 Citywide since January 1, our "Asphalt Avengers" have repaired 409 potholes and counting.

Public Works Parking Lot

- Public Works Street Construction
 Crews upgraded 48,000 sq ft of the
 Public Works parking lot from caliche
 & gravel to new asphalt.
- This is a great improvement to the parking for our work units by keeping the dust and grime to a minimum.






Curb Painting Program

- New equipment purchased for the Curb Painting Program arrived on 5/1.
- Curb Painting started 5/7.
- Refreshed 255 LF out of 295 LF of curb in the Meadows of Kyle Subdivision.
- Plum Creek is next on the schedule and should begin on 5/13 with an approximate linear footage of 5,430 feet.Work should be completed within 5-10 working days, weather permitting.

III. INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECT UPDATES CONTINUED

Community Gardens:

- In a concerted partnership with PARD, Public Works has been integral to the recentCommunity Garden construction, tasked with building the sidewalks and parking areas. Below are the totals so far.
- SidewalkConstructed 305 ft (2,860 sq ft)
- ADA SidewalkConstructed 218 ft (1,090 sq ft)
- Total Parking Lot Constructed 22' x 130' (2,860 sq ft)
- ADA Parking Area 22' x 25' (550 sq ft)
- Four ConcretePads (1,256 sq ft) Constructed for the Gardens



FM 110 Waterline:

- Contractor working on asphalt driveway at Yarrington Pump Station.
- Final changes order being developed for additional pipe lengths and valves.
- Substantial completion progress meeting was held on May 3, 2024.
- Project approximately 97% complete based on last pay application.

Visit the library circulation desk to pick up a paper reading log and physically record your reading by 15-minute intervals.

Prize Milestones

Children (age 11 and younger) can pick up prizes in-person when they achieve the 2, 4, 6, 8, & 10 hour milestones.

Teenagers (age 12 - 17) can choose between obtaining the child prizes -OR- adult prizes, and pick up prizes in-person when they achieve the designated milestones.

Adults (age 18 and older) can pick up prizes in-person when they achieve the 5 & 10 hour milestones.

The goal of the summer reading program is to read, or be read to, for 10 hours in total between June 3rd and July 20th.
