### I. Call Meeting to Order

Mayor Mitchell called the meeting to order at 7:07 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Mayor Mitchell asked the city secretary to call roll.

Present were: Mayor Mitchell, Mayor Pro Tem Koch, Council Member Ellison, Council Member Flores-Cale, Council Member Rizo, Council Member Bradshaw, and Council Member Tobias. A quorum was present.

Mayor Mitchell stated that if there were no objections, he would like to postpone some of the presentations that do not have statutory deadlines until the next council meeting. There were none. He also stated that if there were no objections, he would like to take Item No. 25 up for discussion early in the meeting.

Mayor Mitchell brought forward the minutes for discussion.

Council Member Rizo moved to approve the minutes of the February 2, 2021 Special Council Meeting and the minutes of the February 2, 2021 Council Meeting. Council Member Bradshaw seconded the motion. All votes aye; motion carried 7-0.

Mayor Mitchell opened citizen comments at 7:10 p.m.

Tracy Scheel was called to speak as registered. She thanked the leadership of the City, along with Council and department heads for their work during the snow event last week. She stated that the leadership stepped up to make it as bearable as it could be. Ms. Scheel continued that the texts and phone calls were amazing, with residents literally being in the dark, those were very helpful. She asked Mr. Sellers to mention during City Manager's Report how people can sign up for those alerts.

Peter Parcher was called to speak as registered. He echoed Ms. Scheel's statements. He spoke about the Emergency Response Team. He spoke about their thirty volunteers ready to go in the event of an emergency. Mr. Parcher said he hopes Council will consider placing the Kyle Veteran's Day Parade on the Agenda. Council Member Rizo also thanked Mr. Parcher for his work during the storm.

With no one else wishing to speak, Mayor Mitchell closed citizen comments at 7:14 p.m.

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25. Discussion and Possible Action to Recognize Kyle City Employees for their Extraordinary Efforts During Winter Storm Uri. ~ Rick Koch, Mayor Pro Tem.

Mayor Mitchell brought forward Item No. 25 for discussion out of order, after Citizen Comments, and gave the floor to Mayor Pro Tem Koch, who presented the item. Many stories were shared about the events and contributions of the community, to include businesses, organizations, community members, City of Kyle employees, and Council. No action was taken.

## IV. Appointments

- 4. Consider nomination and take action for appointment to the Planning and Zoning Commission to fill unexpired term. ~ Howard J. Koontz, Director of Planning and Community Development
  - Brandon James (Seat 6)

Mayor Mitchell brought forward Item No. 4 for discussion. Mr. Koontz presented the item. Mr. Brandon James introduced himself and provided background information.

Council Member Ellison moved to approve the nomination of Brandon James to Seat 6 of the Planning and Zoning Commission to fill unexpired term. Council Member Rizo seconded the motion.

There was discussion on the motion. Council Member Ellison asked how many applicants there were for the position. Mr. Koontz stated there were 13. Council Member Ellison asked how many were interviewed. Mr. Koontz stated there were six, but only five were actually interviewed. Council Member Ellison then asked why they chose to interview six. Mr. Koontz stated that the amount of experience documented set these apart. Council Member Ellison asked who decided on interviewing six. Mr. Koontz stated it was the Mayor, City Manager, Chair of Planning & Zoning, and himself. Mr. Koontz elaborated that his staff in Community Development created the "short list". Council Member Ellison spoke about his own service on the Planning & Zoning Commission, that when he applied, he had no experience; his experience is in banking and finance. He stated that it is a different time that there were 13 applicants, for one, and that the applicants came with applicable experience. Council Member Ellison asked Mr. Koontz what his staff was looking for in creating a short list. Mr. Koontz stated, professional experience, prior experience in group settings and other boards and commissions, outside commitments, knowledge of real estate, and experience related to the subject matter. Council Member Ellison stated that he likely would not have been granted an interview based on these criteria, as well as perhaps some of his colleagues on council and other previous amazing Planning and Zoning Commissioners. He asked whether there is a set criterion for applicants who want to serve on Planning & Zoning, Council Member Ellison cautioned the use of professional experience as a narrowing tool before applicants are even interviewed. He stated that he struggles with that. He then asked whether outside of that there was any reason to reduce the number of interviews. Mr. Koontz stated that due to the time frame of getting these confirmed, at the time, on February 16, they took the six that they thought were most likely to get the position. Council Member Ellison asked what Mr. Koontz meant by that. Mr. Koontz went into detail about qualifications of these applicants having experience to perform the tasks of the position. Mr. Sellers spoke about the 2015 decision on how to select members of boards and commissions. Prior to that time, there was not a great understanding of qualifications for applicants to serve. The current policy allows for the Chair of the board and commission to create that criteria. Mayor Mitchell spoke about having served on the appointment board for Parks Board in City Council Meeting Minutes February 23, 2021 - Page 4 Kyle City Hall

the past and the board would ask the applicant to name all the parks in the City for the purpose of establishing interest and general knowledge about the position for which they are applying. He continued that with this policy, it was the intention to take out as much politics as possible. They would also try to gauge the applicant's temperament. He stated that Council could bring back the policy to amend it and require an interview for every applicant. Council Member Ellison stated that in 2015 the City was definitely in a different place and they could never have known that there would be so much interest. He stated that the minimum qualifications are there for residents to see, so perhaps they didn't put their engineering experience. He also wants to ensure that other applicants who are not selected are informed of the status of their application. He believes that the four that are on the interview board should be the ones to reduce the list of applicants. He would like to clarify that this is not about Brandon James, he believes he is qualified, enthusiastic and will be a great asset to the Commission. Council Member Flores-Cale asked whether Council Member Ellison would have been happy if the board had interviewed all 13 applicants. Council Member Ellison stated yes, he would be satisfied had all applicants been interviewed. Council Member Flores-Cale asked whether applicants were followed up with. Council Member Ellison stated that it has not been consistent.

All votes aye; motion carried 7-0.

Mayor Mitchell moved to approve the reappointment of Roman Wommack to Seat 4 and Victor Medina to Seat 6 on the Kyle Parks and Recreation Board to fill expired terms. Council Member Flores-Cale seconded the motion. All votes aye; motion carried 7-0.

After the vote, Council Member Rizo asked whether the other two applicants were contacted. Ms. Espinoza affirmed.

Council Member Rizo moved to approve a Resolution of Support for a Housing Tax Credit Application for The Katherine, a 55+ Affordable Rental Housing Development, and Commitment of Development Funding by a Local Political Subdivision. Council Member Flores-Cale seconded the motion.

There was discussion on the motion. Council Member Ellison stated that he would be supportive in another part of the city other than the proposed area in discussion. Council Member Flores-Cale asked whether she might find a more appropriate location. Ms. Spokas spoke about the economics of affordable housing. Council Member Bradshaw asked for clarification that Council could still change their direction after this letter of support. Mayor Mitchell stated that yes Council could change direction, but the pressure would be high to vote yes after this first yes vote. Council Member Ellison stated that this is the reason he will be voting no.

Mayor Mitchell requested a roll call vote. Council Member Rizo voted aye; Council Member Bradshaw voted aye; Council Member Ellison voted nay; Council Member Tobias voted nay; Mayor Pro Tem Koch voted nay; Council Member Flores-Cale voted aye; and Mayor Mitchell voted nay.

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Motion failed 3-4.
