CITIZEN COMMENT PERIOD WITH CITY COUNCIL

Mayor Johnson opened the citizens comment period at 7:03 P.M. and called for comments on items not on the agenda or posted for public hearing. Mark Ray a resident of Plum Creek spoke and stated that he would like it put on public record a petition he sent to the City about thirty days ago and that the main goal he and other residents in attendance for the petition was to reduce speeding and raise awareness for the children at play and the danger of unlabeled blind corners at Wetzel. He stated that he and the undersigned petition the Mayor and Council to make immediate road safety improvements to ensure a safer environment for the current families, pedestrians and motorists of Wetzel Drive. Michael Wilson a resident of Plum Creek spoke and stated he had the same concerns as did Mark Ray, the previous speaker, but with less concern of speed but with cars parking on both sides of the street making it one lane and the possibility of a major accident occurring and children getting hurt or fire trucks not being able to get through in an emergency. Trista Fugate, representing PEC spoke and invited all to annual meeting on Saturday at the Performing Arts Center with activities for families and door prizes. Council Member David Wilson read a letter sent to him from Mary Etheredge expressing concerns with the proposed roundabout at the intersection of Kohlers Crossing and FM 1626 and that she had not heard of any plans for a crosswalk. She stated that retail shops would most likely come to this location and with the opening of ACC students would probably walk to these places of business and make this a dangerous crossing and asked Council to consider the safety of pedestrians as they moved forward to improve the intersections. The next item was the Road Bond Calendar and Mr. Lambert stated there was an attachment on the agenda identifying the activities associated with the Road Bonds for the next five years. He stated that Engineers would be interviewed and hopefully selected in August of this year. He stated the Engineers would design the projects with the first project bid out in May 2014 and the first project completed in June 2015.

He stated that he was appointing James Earp as the Street Construction Manager for the street bond project and that he and Steven Widacki, City Engineer would prepare an in house team to manage the day to day management of the construction projects. He stated that they would be bring council a proposal to hire an employee out of the bond proceeds to help on the technical aspects of the project, either a land acquisition agent or an assistant GIS Tech or some sort of Engineering Tech.

Mr. Lambert stated that he was asking for permission to file a loan application with the Texas Water Development Board to do the preliminary repairs on 4 worst water retention towers and water tanks in the City, which would include repairs, draining, sand blasting and repainting them. He stated the cost would be around \$750,000 to \$1 million dollars. He stated he thought the City could get a 20 year loan and borrow \$750,000 dollars with a payment of approximately \$64,000. dollars for 20 years, with an approximate 50 cent per customer per month rate increase in water rates.

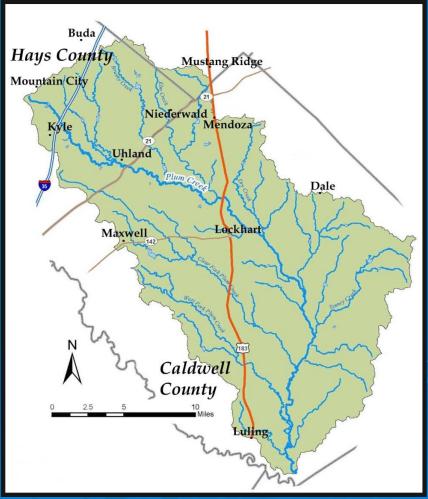




The Plum Creek Watershed

- Major tributary to the San Marcos River
- Plum Creek was placed on the State of Texas 2004 303(d) List of Impaired Waters for exceeding the water quality standard for <u>bacteria (E</u> <u>.coli</u>) and still does not support its <u>designated use for contact</u> <u>recreation,</u> (126 org./100 ml for contact recreation)
- Plum Creek is also listed on the 2010 Texas Integrated Report for concerns that include depressed <u>dissolved oxygen</u> and <u>elevated</u> <u>nutrient</u> concerns for nitrates, orthophosphorus and total phosphorous.







Plum Creek Watershed Protection Plan

- Watershed Protection Plans are Voluntary and have no regulatory authority
- A local Steering Committee of members throughout the watershed representing all types of stakeholders has directed the process
- The goals of the plan are to reduce pollution and improve water quality
- Plan includes strategies for each of the potential sources in the watershed
- An Interlocal Agreement signed by 12 Project Partners in 2011 provided matching funds for a CWA §319(h) grant to support a local watershed coordinator

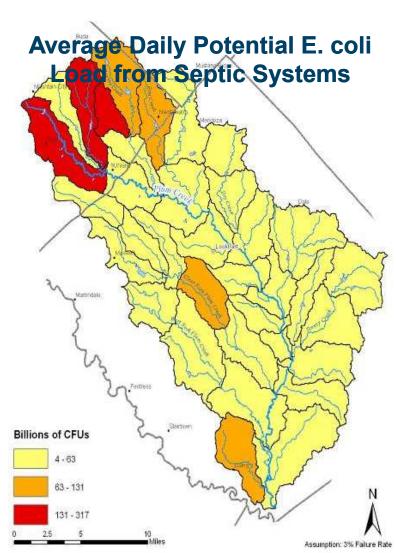

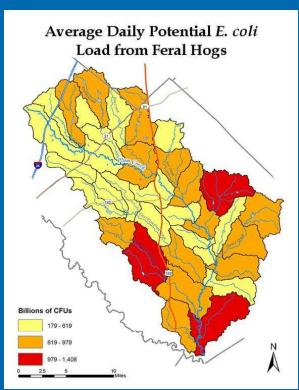
Hillside Terrace Project

- Over 265 homes in the subdivision are on onsite wastewater systems
- Majority of lots are small, wastewater issues are reported often to the County
- The total project for infrastructure to connect these homes is estimated to cost \$5.6 Million (Planning and Design - \$400K)
- Funding through Clean Water State Revolving Fund Loan
 Program low-interest loans and principal forgiveness
- 2012 was the third year for consideration of the Hillside Terrace Project
- Project qualified for 70% loan forgiveness toward P&D due to disadvantaged community status.
- October 30, 2012 Interlocal agreement approved by Hays County Commissioner's Court to split costs with City of Buda for unfunded principal portion of P&D.
- November 1, 2012 Application submitted to TWDB.
- April 18, 2013 TWDB approves financing and loan forgiveness for \$400,000 P&D

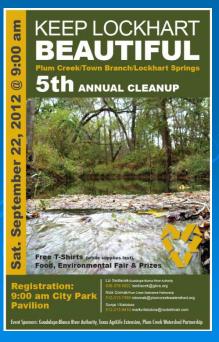












2012 Kyle WWTP Spills

- Kyle WWTP operated by Aqua Texas
- Plant malfunction resulted in spills into Plum Creek on November 20 and December 3, 2012
- Total volume of spills unknown
- Black sludge first noted at Heidenreich Lane during routine sampling by GBRA on 11/15
- Plum Creek Development wet well filling with unusual number of solids in November
- Watershed coordinator conducted approximately 10 post-spill site visits with representatives from TCEQ, Aqua Texas and TPWD
- TCEQ requested dewatering and additional
 clean up by Aqua Texas. This began in early
 March.

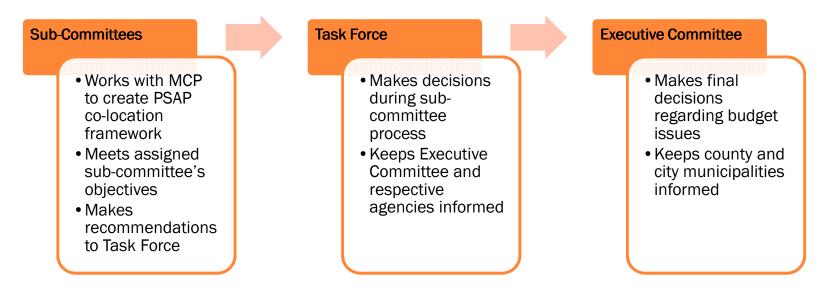

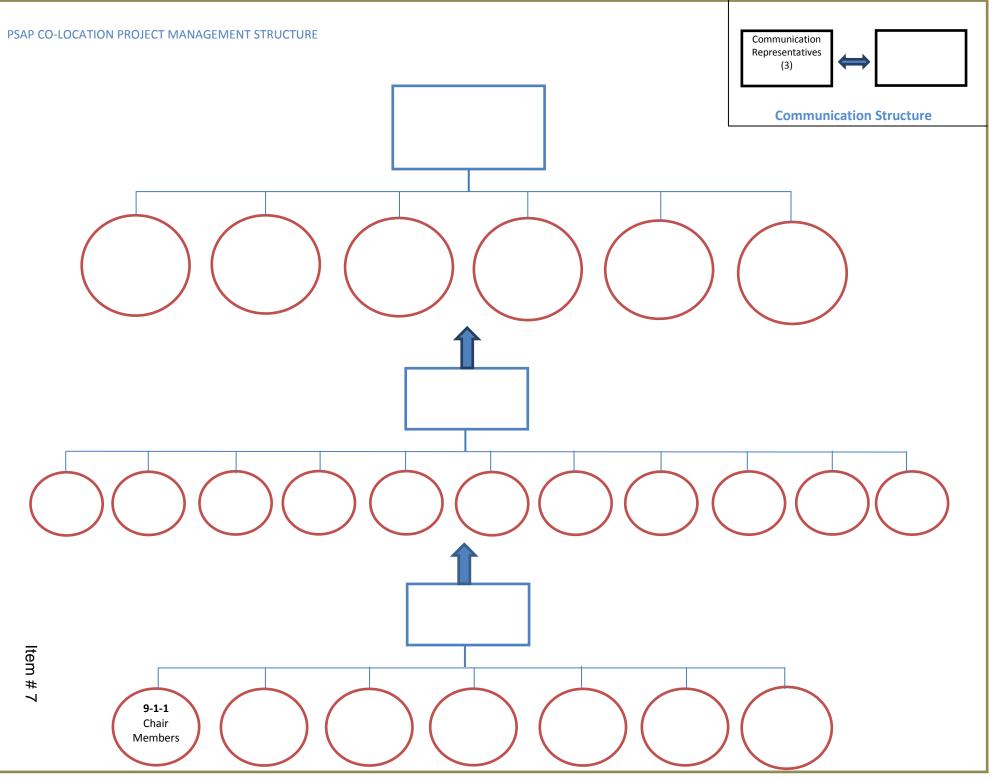

STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT MASTER AGREEMENT - NUMBER 1017553

This Amendment ("Amendment") is effective as of the _____day of ______, 2013 ("Amendment Effective Date") and shall amend that certain State and Local Government Master Agreement – Number 1017553 dated as of the 8th day of August, 2008, as amended by an Addendum dated as of the 8th day of August, 2008, (collectively the "Master Agreement") by and between City of Kyle ("Customer") and Ricoh USA, Inc. (f/k/a IKON Office Solutions, Inc.) ("Ricoh").

The parties intending to be legally bound, agree that the Master Agreement shall be modified as follows:

- 1. <u>Section 5 (Taxes and Fees)</u>. The last sentence of Section 5 shall be deleted in its entirety.
- 2. <u>Section 12 (Remedies)</u>. The first sentence of Section 12 shall be amended to read as follows:

"If a Default occurs, we may do one or more of the following with fifteen (15) days written notice to you: (a) we may cancel or terminate this Master Agreement; (b) we may require you..."

3. <u>Section 12 (Remedies)</u>. The third sentence of Section 12 shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

"In the event an action is brought to enforce or interpret this Master Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to reimbursement of all costs including, but not limited to, reasonable attorney fees and court costs incurred."

4. <u>Section 15 (Miscellaneous)</u>. The fifth and sixth sentences of Section 15 shall be amended to read as follows:

"Neither this Master Agreement nor any Schedule is binding on either party until we sign it. Any change in any of the terms and conditions of this Master Agreement or any Schedule must be in writing and signed by both parties."

5. <u>Section 19 (Non-Appropriation/Non-Substitution)</u>. Section 19(c) shall be amended to read as follows:

"(c) Upon any such Non-Appropriation, upon our request, you will provide, upon our request, an opinion of counsel (who shall be reasonably acceptable to us), in a form reasonably acceptable to us, confirming the Non-Appropriation and providing reasonably sufficient proof of such Non-Appropriation."

6. <u>Section 21 (Authority and Authorization)</u>. Section 21(b) shall be amended to read as follows:

"(b) If and to the extent required by us, you agree to provide us with an opinion of counsel (who shall be reasonably acceptable to us), substantially in the form attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u>, confirming the foregoing and other related matters."

All capitalized words used but not defined in this Amendment will have the meanings given to them in the Master Agreement. Except to the extent modified by this Amendment, the terms and conditions of the Master Agreement will remain unchanged and shall continue in full force and effect.

On June 25th the Planning Commission voted 4-0 to recommend approval. **Background**

Proposal

INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT FOR MUTUAL EXTRATERRITORIAL JURISDICTION (ETJ) RELEASE AND REVISION OF AGREED ETJ BOUNDARIES BETWEEN THE CITY OF KYLE AND CITY OF SAN MARCOS TEXAS

This Interlocal Cooperation Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into effective as of the date of execution by authorized representatives of the parties and subject to certain conditions precedent, by and between the **City of San Marcos**, Texas ("San Marcos"), a Texas home rule municipal corporation, and the **City of Kyle**, Texas ("Kyle"), a Texas home rule municipal corporation, and through their authorized representatives.

WHEREAS, on June 8, 1987, by Resolution 1987-72R the San Marcos City Council approved an agreement that established ETJ boundaries with the City of Kyle and now both cities desire to amend and supplement that agreement by entering into an additional Agreement whereby both cities agree to release and exchange ETJ and revise their ETJ boundaries; and

WHEREAS, that the agreement between the City of San Marcos and the City of Kyle establishing respective ETJ boundaries between the two cities and which was approved by the San Marcos City Council on June 8, 1987, by Resolution 1987-72R is hereby amended; and

WHEREAS, agreements regarding areas adjacent to the cities' respective extraterritorial jurisdiction ("ETJ") will assist and enhance the planning for development and capital improvement programs and services; and

WHEREAS, the City of Kyle desires to release from their ETJ properties including approximately 388.8 acres south of County Road 158 and east of the Quail Ridge Subdivision (Tract D on Exhibit B, consisting of HCAD Parcel IDs R14883, R14884, R14937, R70250, and R70463), approximately 86.2 acres south of County Road 158 near the intersection of Drue Drive (Tract E on Exhibit B, consisting of HCAD Parcels IDs R14874, R14932, R14953 and R115651) and approximately 123.0 acres within the 288.1 acre parcel R14874 (Tract F on Exhibit B), all being south of the boundary line described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes, may be included in San Marcos' ETJ; and

WHEREAS, the City of San Marcos desires to release from their ETJ properties including approximately 132.6 acres on the west side of State Hwy 21 adjacent to the intersection of E RR 150 (Tract A on Exhibit B consisting of HCAD Parcel IDs R14899, R14925, R14956, R17630 and R135865), approximately 4.29 acres out of the 140.6 acre parcel R62214 (Tract B on Exhibit B) and approximately 1.96 acres on the north side of County Road 158 west of Raymond Drive (Tract C on Exhibit B consisting of HCAD Parcel IDs R88952, R131861 and R127764), all being north of the boundary line described in Exhibit "A", attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes, may be included in Kyle's ETJ; and

WHEREAS, San Marcos agrees to release Tracts A, B and C by the ordinance approving this Agreement, and Kyle agrees to release Tracts D, E and F by the ordinance approving this Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the laws of the State of Texas, including Texas Local Government Code Sections 42.022(b), 42.022(d) and 42.023, for and in consideration of the covenants, conditions and undertakings hereinafter described, and the benefits to accrue to the cities, and subject to each and every term and condition of this Agreement, the parties contract, covenant and agree as follows:

Article One Findings and Declarations

Section 1.1 Fact Findings. The recitals above are adopted as findings by the governing bodies of San Marcos and Kyle, and are incorporated herein for all purposes. The governing bodies of San Marcos and Kyle have authorized and approved this Agreement.

Article Two Effective Date and Nature of Agreement

Section 2.1 Effective Date of Agreement. This Agreement shall commence on the date of signature by authorized representatives of both cities ("Effective Date").

Section 2.2 Intent and Purpose. The intent and purpose of this Agreement is to provide for effective and efficient municipal planning and development, and the release of ETJ as set out in this Agreement.

Section 2.3 Map. References in this Agreement to any geographic areas referred to the area named and shown on the Map attached hereto as Exhibit "B" are incorporated herein for all purposes.

Article Three Release of ETJ

Section 3.1 ETJ Mutual Release. San Marcos will release, by ordinance approving this Agreement, the portion of San Marcos ETJ identified as Tracts A, B and C as shown on Exhibit "B" to this Agreement. Kyle will release Tracts D, E and F as shown on Exhibit "B" to this Agreement. The mutual release of ETJ will occur upon approval of the ordinance approving this Agreement and the execution of this Agreement by both parties.

Article Four General and Miscellaneous

Section 4.1 Jurisdiction. This Agreement shall not be deemed to extend or increase the jurisdiction or authority of either of the Cities except as necessary to implement and give effect to this Agreement. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to be applicable to, or an attempt to limit or restrict, the legal rights, authority or jurisdiction of any other governmental entity.

Section 4.2 Governmental Immunity. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to waive, modify or amend any legal defense available at law or in equity to either of the cities nor to create any legal rights or claims on behalf of any third party. Neither Kyle nor San Marcos waives, modifies, or alters to any extent whatsoever the availability of the defense of governmental immunity under the laws of the State of Texas.

Section 4.3 Exhibits. The following exhibits are incorporated into this Agreement by reference as if fully set out herein:

Exhibits "A" and "B."

Section 4.4 Severability. In the event any provision of this Agreement shall be held invalid or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provision hereof.

WHEREAS, on June 8, 1987, by Resolution 1987-72R the San Marcos City Council approved an agreement that established ETJ boundaries with the City of Kyle and now both cities desire to amend that agreement by entering into an additional Agreement whereby both cities agree to release and exchange ETJ: and

WHEREAS, that the agreement between the City of San Marcos and the City of Kyle establishing respective ETJ boundaries between the two cities and which was approved by the San Marcos City Council on June 8, 1987, by Resolution 1987-72R is hereby amended and restated in its entirety; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Kyle desires to release a portion of its extraterritorial jurisdiction and execute the attached "Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for Mutual Extraterritorial Jurisdiction (ETJ) Release" ("Agreement") with the City of San Marcos, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Kyle desires to authorize the Mayor to execute any documents necessary for the approval and implementation of the Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KYLE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. <u>Findings</u>. All of the above premises are hereby found to be true and correct legislative and factual findings of the City Council of San Marcos, and are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if copied in their entirely.

SECTION 2. Release and Inclusion of Area in ETJ; Filing and Display.

1. That the City Council of the City of Kyle hereby approves the release of a portion of its ETJ in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein for all purposes (hereafter "Kyle Release Area"); and

- 2. That the City Council of the City of Kyle hereby approves the attached Agreement between the City of Kyle and the City of San Marcos regarding the mutual release and exchange of portions of each City's ETJ. Upon Kyle's release of the appropriate area from Kyle's ETJ, (hereafter, the "Kyle Release Areas) shall be included and for all purposes brought within the boundaries of the City of San Marcos' ETJ, and made an integral part, thereof, subject to the terms and conditions of the Agreement; and
- 3. That Kyle's ETJ is hereby expanded to include the San Marcos Release Areas described in the Agreement and any attachments thereto (hereafter, the "San Marcos Release Areas"). Upon Kyle's release of the appropriate areas from Kyle's ETJ, the Kyle Release Areas are hereby included and for all purposes brought within the boundaries of the City of San Marcos' ETJ, and is made an integral part, thereof, subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- 4. That this Ordinance does not apply to any portion of the Kyle Release Area that is currently within the ETJ of another municipality and for which consent has not been or will not be granted by the releasing municipality. Any portion of the Areas that is not released from another municipality's ETJ is expressly excluded from this Ordinance. This Ordinance shall not be construed to in any way alter, modify or revise the ETJ of any municipality other than the City of San Marcos. Any portion of San Marcos as a result of the release of ETJ pursuant to this Ordinance or the Agreement shall be deemed to have been hereby released by the City of San Marcos.
- 5. That the official map and boundaries of the City of Kyle are hereby amended and revised so as to include the San Marcos Release Areas and to exclude the Kyle Release Area.
- 6. That the owners and inhabitants of the Areas entitled to all of the rights and privileges of other citizens of the City of Kyle's ETJ, and are hereby bound by all acts, ordinances and other legal actions now in full force and effect, and those that may be hereafter adopted or enacted, regarding the ETJ.
- 7. That the City Secretary is hereby instructed to include this Ordinance in the records of the City.
- 8. That the Mayor is hereby instructed to file a certified copy of this Ordinance and attachments with the Hays County Clerk and other appropriate entities.
- 9. That the City Planning Director is hereby instructed to have maps depicting the new municipal boundaries prepared.
- 10. That the Mayor of the City of Kyle is hereby authorized to execute any documents necessary for the approval and implementation of said Agreement between the City of Kyle and the City of San Marcos, and the expansion of Kyle's ETJ.

SECTION 3. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Ordinance is effective and the expansion of the ETJ achieved herein shall become effective ninety days from the date of final adoption of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. <u>Severability</u>. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this Ordinance be severable. If any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or *ultra vires* by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or illegality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs or sections of this Ordinance, and the remainder of this Ordinance shall be enforced as written. The voiding by a court of any ETJ expansion previously approved by the City of San Marcos shall not be construed in any way to affect any other ETJ expansion by the City.

SECTION 5. <u>Proper Notice and Meeting</u>. It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was passed was open to the public as required and that a public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code.

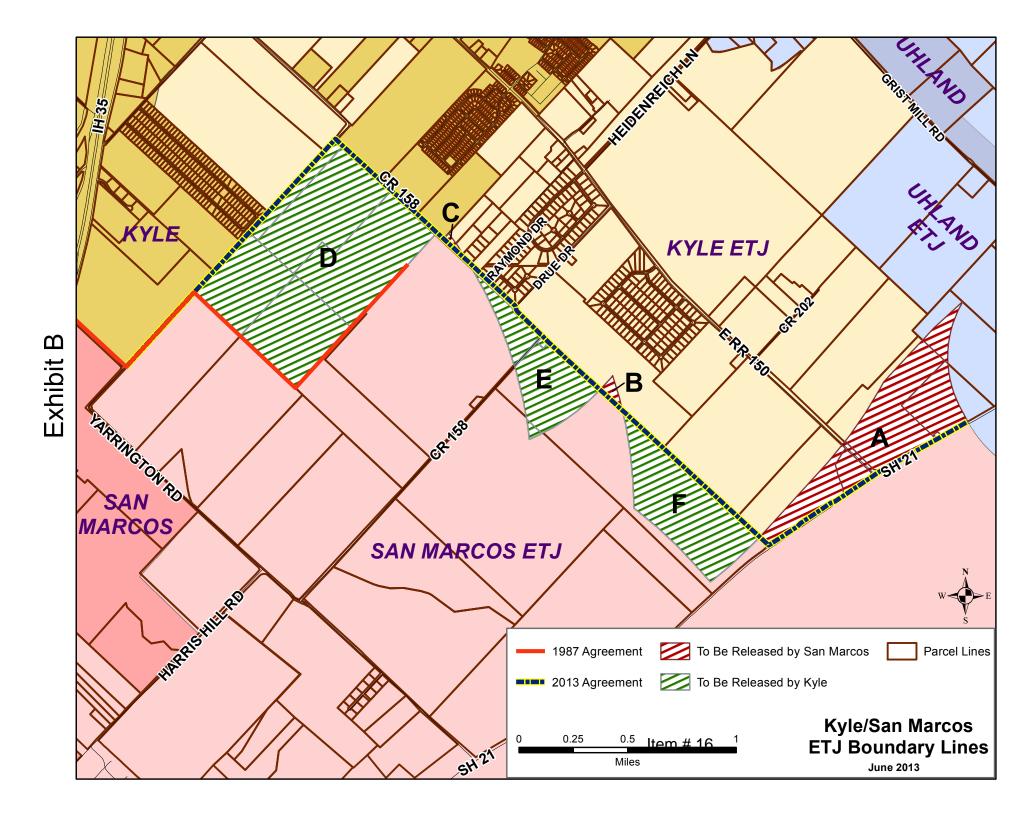

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 23 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, MISCELLANEOUS OFFENSES OF THE CITY OF KYLE SO AS TO ADD ARTICLE IX MASS GATHERINGS AND ESTABLISH PERMIT REQUIRMENTS, APPLICATION PROCESS AND REGULATE NOISE LEVELS FROM SUCH EVENTS, DECLARING A PUBLIC PURPOSE, ESTABLISHING A PENALTY AND SETTING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined a municipal need to establish a permit and application process for Mass Gatherings, including but not limited to concerts, revivals and circuses, and to regulate noise levels from such gatherings; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined these new requirements are necessary to maintain the health, safety, governance and good order of the City; and

WHEREAS, after publication in the manner prescribed by law the governing body of the City wishes to amend Chapter 23 by adding Article IX, Sections 23-270 to 23-282 of the Municipal Code of Ordinances of the City in the manner and form set forth below;

NOW, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KYLE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the existing Chapter 23 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Kyle entitled "Miscellaneous Offenses" is hereby amended by adding Article IX, "Mass Gatherings," Sections 23-270 to 23-280 to read as follows:

ARTICLE IX. – MASS GATHERINGS

Sec. 23-270. – Definitions.

- (a) "Mass gathering" means a gathering that is held inside the limits of the City of Kyle and that attracts or is expected to attract:
 - (i) more than 2,500 persons; or
 - (ii) more than 500 persons, if 51 percent or more of those persons may reasonably be expected to be younger than 21 years of age and it is planned or may reasonably be expected that alcoholic beverages will be sold, served, or consumed at or around the gathering; and

(iii) at which the persons will remain for more than four continuous hours; or for any amount of time during the period beginning at 10 p.m. and ending at 6 a.m.

- (b) "Person" means an individual, group of individuals, firm, corporation, partnership, or association.
- (c) "Promote" includes organize, manage, finance, or hold.
- (d) "Promoter" means a person who promotes a mass gathering.

Sec. 23-271. – Permit Requirement.

A person may not promote a mass gathering without a permit issued under this Article. City Council shall establish cost for such permit.

Sec. 23-272. – Application Procedure.

- (a) At least forty five (45) days before the date on which a mass gathering will be held, the promoter shall file a permit application with the City. Applications submitted less than forty five (45) days prior to the event may still be considered; however, the applicant acknowledges that the required inspections and review process may not be completed in time to allow for authorization and permitting.
- (b) The application must include:
 - (1) the promoter's name and address;
 - (2) the name and address of the owner of the property on which the mass gathering will be held;
 - (3) an executed copy of the agreement between the promoter and the property owner;
 - (4) the location and a description of the property on which the mass gathering will be held;
 - (5) the dates and times that the mass gathering will be held;
 - (6) the maximum number of persons the promoter will allow to attend the mass gathering and the plan the promoter intends to use to limit attendance to that number;
 - (7) a description of each step the promoter has taken to ensure that minimum standards of sanitation and health will be maintained during the mass gathering;
 - (8) a description of all preparations being made to provide traffic control, to ensure that the mass gathering will be conducted in an orderly manner, and to protect the physical safety of the persons who attend the mass gathering;
 - (9) a description of the preparations made to provide adequate medical care; and
 - (10) a description of the preparations made to supervise minors who may attend the mass gathering.

Sec. 23-273. – Application Review.

- (a) After a permit application is filed with the City, the application shall be sent to the county health authority, the Hays County Fire Marshal (hereinafter called the county fire marshal) and the Police Chief.
- (b) The county health authority shall inquire into preparations for the mass gathering. At least fifteen (15) days before the date of the Mass Gathering, the county health authority shall submit to the Police Chief a report stating whether the health authority believes that the minimum

standards of health and sanitation prescribed by state and local laws, rules, and orders will be maintained.

- (c) The county fire marshal shall investigate preparations for the mass gathering. At least fifteen (15) days before the date of the Mass Gathering, the county fire marshal shall submit to the Police Chief a report stating whether the fire marshal believes that the minimum standards for ensuring public fire safety and order as prescribed by state and local laws, rules, and orders will be maintained.
- (d) Police Chief, or designee, shall investigate preparations for the mass gathering. At least fifteen (15) days before the date of the Mass Gathering, the Police Chief shall make a determination on whether the minimum standards for ensuring public safety and order that are prescribed by state and local laws, rules, and orders will be maintained.
- (e) The City Manager may conduct any additional investigation that the Manager considers necessary.

Sec. 23-274. – Decision by Police Chief.

- (a) After a review of the reports from the county fire marshal and county health authority, the Police Chief shall either grant or deny the permit. The decision of the Police Chief shall be no later than the 10th day before the date on which a mass gathering will begin
- (b) The Police Chief may deny the permit if he finds that:

(1) the application contains false or misleading information or omits required information;

(2) the location selected for the mass gathering is inadequate for the purpose for which it will be used;

(3) the promoter has not made adequate preparations to limit the number of persons attending the mass gathering or to provide adequate supervision for minors attending the mass gathering;

(4) the promoter does not have assurance that scheduled performers will appear;

(5) the preparations for the mass gathering do not ensure that minimum standards of sanitation and health will be maintained;

(6) the preparations for the mass gathering do not ensure that the mass gathering will be conducted in an orderly manner and that the physical safety of persons attending will be protected;

(9) adequate arrangements for traffic control have not been provided; or

(10) adequate medical and nursing care will not be available.

Sec. 23-275. –Permit Revocation.

The Police Chief may revoke a permit issued under this Article if the Police Chief finds that preparations for the mass gathering will not be completed by the time the mass gathering will begin, for any reason identified in Section 23-274 (b), or that the permit was obtained by fraud or misrepresentation.

Sec. 23-276. – Appeal

A promoter or a person affected by the granting, denying, or revoking of a permit may appeal that action to the City Council or if time does not permit for a City Council meeting to be called, the appeal can be to a district court having jurisdiction in Hays County.

Sec. 23-277. – Inspections.

- (a) The county health authority may inspect a mass gathering during the mass gathering to ensure that the minimum standards of health and sanitation prescribed by state and local laws, rules, and orders are being maintained. If the county health authority determines a violation of the minimum standards is occurring, the health authority may order the promoter of the mass gathering to correct the violation.
- (b) The county fire marshal may inspect a mass gathering during the mass gathering to ensure that the minimum standards for ensuring public fire safety and order as prescribed by state and local laws, rules, and orders are being maintained. If the marshal determines a violation of the minimum standards is occurring, the marshal or designee may order the promoter of the mass gathering to correct the violation.
- (c) The police chief may inspect a mass gathering during the mass gathering to ensure that the minimum standards for ensuring public safety and order prescribed by state and local laws, rules, and orders are being maintained. If the police chief determines a violation is occurring, the police chief may order the promoter of the mass gathering to correct the violation.
- (d) A promoter who fails to comply with an order issued under this section commits an offense. An offense under this section is a Class C misdemeanor.

Sec. 23-278. – Noise

Any unreasonably loud, disturbing or unnecessary noise which causes material distress, discomfort or injury to persons of ordinary sensibilities in the immediate vicinity of the Mass Gathering, or any noise of such character, intensity and continued duration which interferes with the comfortable enjoyment of private homes by persons of ordinary sensibilities is prohibited and is hereby declared a nuisance. All other regulations in Chapter 23, Article VI of the City Code or Ordinances regarding Noise shall apply to Mass Gatherings.

Sec. 23-279. – Permit and Inspection Fees

- (a) City Council may establish and collect a fee for an inspection performed under Section 23-277. The fee may not exceed the amount necessary to defray the costs of performing the inspections.
- (b) City Council may use a portion of inspection fees collected under this section to reimburse the County for the cost of performing the inspections outlined in Section 23-277.
- (c) The Mass Gathering Permit fee amount is initially set at \$300.00 per event permit effective with the adoption of this Ordinance and the fee amount is subject to adjustments by the City Council. The Mass Gathering Permit Fee is subject to annual adjustments to the fee amount as authorized by the City Council and made part of the City's Fees and Charges Schedule as adopted each year with the City's Budget Ordinance.

Sec. 23-281. – Exceptions to Permit and Fee

The following types of mass gatherings are required to notify the Chief of Police ten (10) days prior to the event, but are not required to obtain a Mass Gatherings Permit or to pay any fees established under Section 23-279.

- (a) Church events held on church property;
- (b) City, school, county or other governmental entity events held on property owned by the governmental entity; or
- (c) Any other exceptions approved by City Council.
- (d) An applicant may request, and the Chief of Police may approve an annual or event series permit for a single location hosting repetitive events of similar nature; including but not limited to attendance, hours of operation, and safety measures as described elsewhere in this ordinance.

Sec. 23-282. - Criminal Penalty.

- (a) A person commits an offense if the person violates Section 23-271.
- (b) An offense under this section is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed \$1,000.

SECTION 2. SAVINGS CLAUSE: All ordinances or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed. The balance of such ordinance is hereby saved from repeal.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or illegal, such decision shall not effect the validity of the remaining sections of this ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance, and each section, subsection, clause, or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared void.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. The Ordinance shall be effective immediately following its publication in the local newspaper as required by the Texas Local

Government Code. Thereafter, the rules contained therein will apply within the City of Bulverde.

STAFF ANALYSIS:

Background

The subject property is approximately 33 acres in size and is generally located along FM 150/Rebel Drive, west of the Silverado Subdivision and east of Rebel Drive. The 33 acres subject to the rezoning request share a common property line with the properties located along the western end of Trinity Drive and the western end of Western Drive.

Comprehensive Plan Guidance

The subject property is located within the Mid-Town future land use district. The future land use district identifies the requested zoning district as a conditional zoning district. The intent of the future land use district has been identified to maximize the value capture of new residential development in Kyle. This District enjoys unusual proximity to amenities, such as open space, Downtown, commercial nodes, and

transit options. The area is therefore well-positioned to define an economic and lifestyle pattern that is unique to Kyle. New development should accommodate mid- to high-density residential uses. The Comprehensive Plan provides the following goals and guidance:

- Within the Midtown District the preferred residential units per acre is 4-6, conditional units per acre less than 4 and 6.1-15 upa, and greater than 15 upa is not recommended.
- Create integrated and inter-connected mixed use districts.
- Establish commercial centers that provide transition between commercial and residential use

Findings

- The applicant is requesting a less intense zoning district than what the property is currently zoned as.
- The requested zoning will create smaller lots in width and overall size compared to the adjacent single family lots in the Silverado Subdivision.
- The proposed rezoning appears to allow for a more functional transition between residential and commercial land uses.
- The requested rezoning appears to allow for a different housing product that what is currently developed in this general area of the city.
- The single-family attached/detached district R-1-A, garden home allows attached or detached single-family structures with a minimum of 1,000 square feet of living area and permitted accessory structures on a minimum lot size of 4,800 square feet. There shall be no more than 6.8 houses per buildable acre. The single-family residences authorized in this zoning district include those generally referred to as garden homes, patio homes and zero lot line homes.

The conditions and limitations for the R-1-A district are as follows:

- Garages are required and must be one of the following designs:
 - Detached with a minimum setback of five feet from the front wall of the home facing front property line;
 - May be attached and must have a minimum setback of five feet from the front wall of the home facing front property line; or
 - May be attached and meet minimum front setback requirements, but must face side property line.
 - Each garage must be designed and constructed with a minimum of 480 square feet.
- All buildings and structures, garages, and/or accessory buildings constructed within this district must have all four sides composed of 100 percent brick, stone, hardiplank or other approved masonry product.

In November 2002 the subject property was annexed into the City and assigned an interim zoning district of Agriculture (Ag). The property is located within the I-35 Overlay District and therefore any non-residential development is subject to the development standards associated with district.

Comprehensive Plan Guidance

Goals Stated in the Comprehensive Master Plan:

- Ensure physical and natural buffer zones around light industrial uses to filter and clean runoff and possible debris.
- Establish land use transitions to enhance the separation of residential and industrial uses.
- Discourage residential development along I-35 to preserve those parcels for regionally oriented development.

Findings

Staff has reviewed the request and direction provided in the Comprehensive Plan and has made the following findings:

- The warehouse district is designed to provide locations for outlets offering goods and services to a targeted segment of the general public as well as industrial users.
- The conditions and limitations on uses in the" W" district are as follows:

(1)The use is conducted primarily within an enclosed building or screened area, except for the customary outdoor activities for the specific use listed.

(2)The use is not objectionable because of odor, excessive light, smoke, dust, noise, vibration or similar nuisance; and that such odor, smoke, dust, noise or vibration at the property line does not exceed the permitted levels established by ordinance.

(3)Signs (advertising) must be in compliance with all applicable ordinances.

(4)Establishments located on property that is within 300 feet of any property zoned for a residential use when the commercial use is first established may not to be open to the general public before 6:00 a.m. and must be closed to the general public by 10:00 p.m.

• The warehouse zoning district is not a recommended zoning district in any of the identified future land use districts however, the I-35 Overlay development standards require a higher level of development standards for the development of the property that exceed the requirements of the base warehouse zoning district.

- The Comprehensive Master Plan identifies a requested industrial use to be contingently appropriate adjacent to an existing retail services/ commercial use. While there is not existing commercial development the property to the south is entitled as a Retail Services' zoned property.
- It appears that the I-35 overlay development standards help to ensure the aesthetic policies of the urban design plan.
- It appears that due to the standards associated with the I-35 overlay district the uses permitted by the proposed change in zoning district classification and the standards applicable to such uses will not substantially affect the public health, safety, morals, or general welfare.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 53 (ZONING) OF THE CITY OF KYLE, TEXAS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ASSIGNING ORIGINAL ZONING OF 'W' WAREHOUSE DISTRICT TO APPROXIMATELY 25.10 ACRES, ON PROPERTY LOCATED AT 23045 IH-35 IN HAYS COUNTY, TEXAS. (NL LAND HOLDING – Z-13-006); AUTHORIZING THE CITY SECRETARY TO AMEND THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF KYLE SO AS TO REFLECT THIS CHANGE: PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION AND EFFECTIVE DATE: SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR AND ORDAINING **OTHER** PROVISIONS RELATED TO THE SUBJECT MATTER HEREOF: FINDING AND DETERMINING THAT THE MEETING AT WHICH THIS ORDINANCE WAS PASSED WAS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC AS REQUIRED BY LAW.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KYLE, TEXAS, THAT:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. That the zoning district map of the City of Kyle adopted in Chapter 53 (Zoning) be and the same is hereby amended to assign original zoning of 'W' Warehoude District to approximately 25.10 acres, on property located at 23045 IH-35, as set forth in the legal description labeled Exhibit A, and the property location map labeled Exhibit B.

<u>SECTION 2</u>. That the City Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to designate the tract of land zoned herein as such on the zoning district map of the City of Kyle and by proper endorsement indicate the authority for said notation.

<u>SECTION 3</u>. If any provision, section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance, or the application of same to any person or set of circumstances is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, void or invalid (or for any reason unenforceable), the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance or the application to such other persons or sets of circumstances shall not be affected hereby, it being the intent of the City Council of the City of Kyle in adopting this Ordinance, that no portion hereof or provision contained herein shall become inoperative or fail by reason of any unconstitutionality or invalidity of any other portion or provision.

<u>SECTION 4</u>. This Ordinance shall be published according to law and shall be and remain in full force and effect from and after the date of publication.

<u>SECTION 5</u>. It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this ordinance was passed was open to the public as required by law.

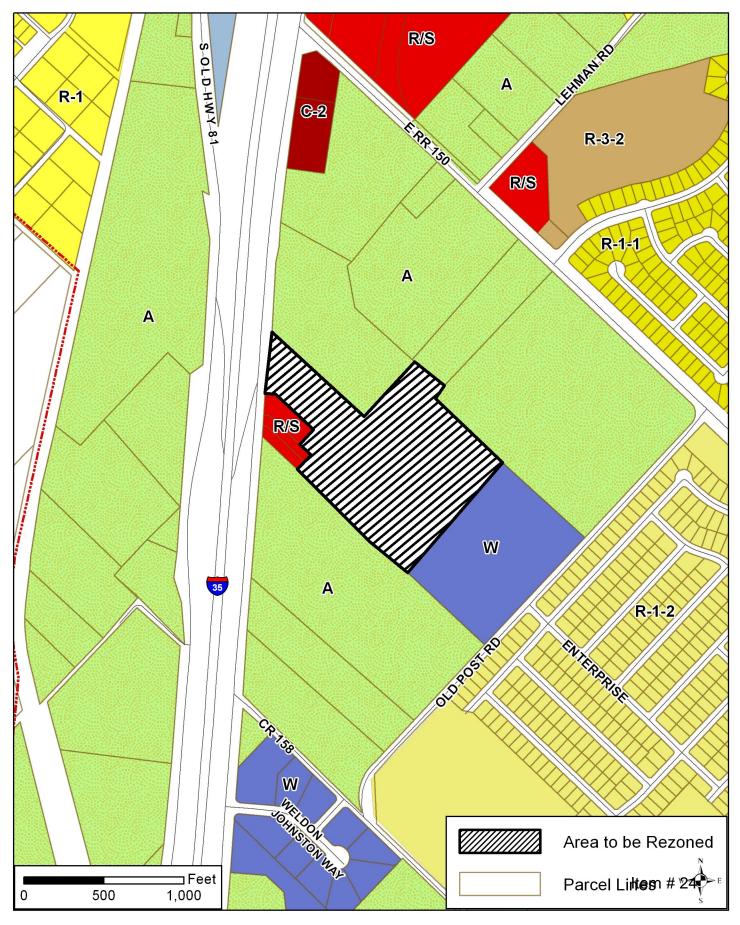

STAFF ANALYSIS: Background

575 RR 150 is located at the corner of Lehman Road and RR 150. The lot as shown in the attached exhibit has two different zoning designations (Retail Services- R/S and R-3-2 multifamily residential 2-please see file labeled zoning exhibit).

When the property was zoned initially in 2002 it was rezoned without a legal description (see ordinance 378-7). The rezoning ordinance simply has an exhibit that was part of the preliminary plat for the subdivision). At the time of the 2002 rezoning the area zoned C-1 was not part of a legal subdivision. The configuration of the property that was reflected in the zoning exhibit later changed in the final plat stage of the subdivision process (that change in lot configuration is what led us to have two zoning designation on 1 legal lot).

In 2005 the City initiated a rezoning for the property zoned C-1 to be rezoned RS (see ordinance 438-24). Again the rezoning ordinance did not have a legal description attached to the ordinance. To further

complicate the situation the description that was used in the ordinance was as follows: "An ordinance of the city of kyle, texas, amending the zoning ordinance by zoning 3.1937 +/- acre tract known as four seasons farm located at lehnan road and fm 150 east, from zoning district C-1 to RS". However at the time the property was platted the legal description of the property was Lot 1Section 3 of the Four Seasons Farm. As a result it appears that not only did the rezoning ordinance not have a legal description it appears that the description they did have was incorrect (see ordinance 438-24 and the attached plat).

The City of Kyle is initiating a rezoning request on the remainder of the lot to ensure the lot has one consistent zoning across the property. It appears that City did not include the correct legal description in the previous city initiated rezoning and staff is working to rectify the error.

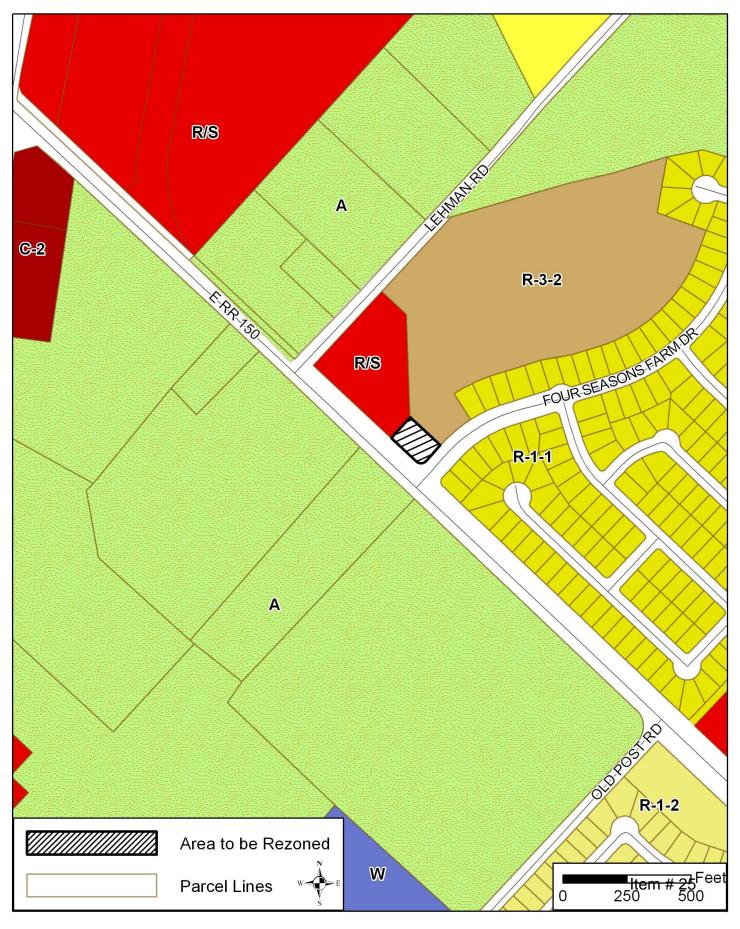

Tract One is accordingly hereby rezoned to district C-1. Tract Two is accordingly hereby rezoned to district R-1-1.

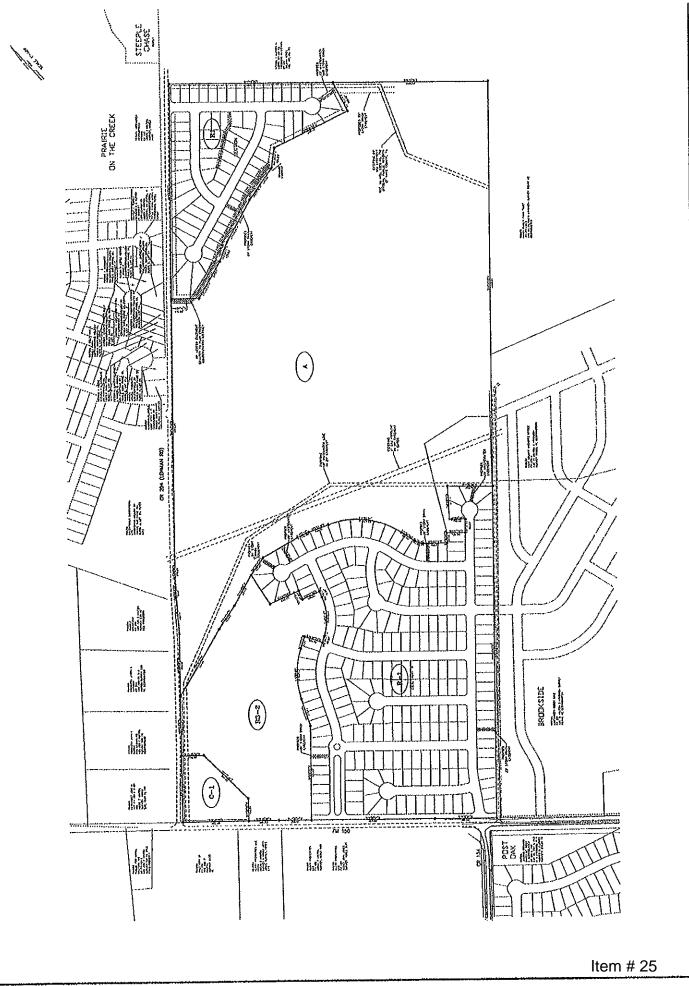

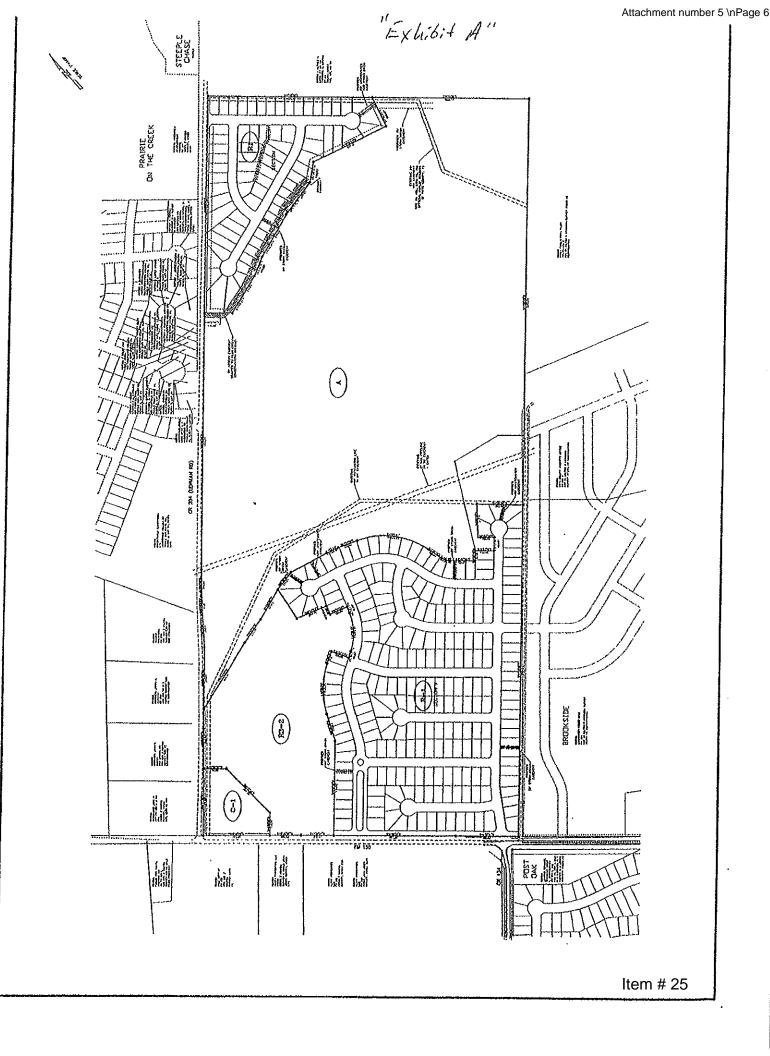

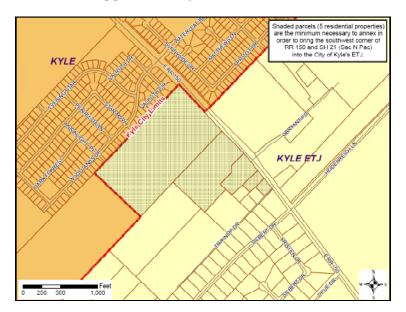

Recommendation

On June 20th the Long Range Planning Committee recommended to the Planning and Zoning Commission to proceed with the annexation. On June 25th the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended to the City to proceed with the annexation.

Location

The subject properties consists of 5 residential tracts of land and are located along E. RR 150, east of the Woodlands Subdivision and west of Seibert Drive/ Heindenrich Lane. The 5 properties together consist of approximately 47.2 acres.

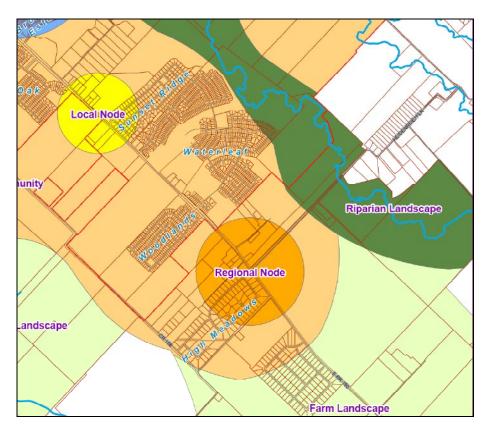


Utilities

The subject properties are located within the County Line water service area and are located approximately 425 feet from the nearest City of Kyle wastewater line. E. RR 150 is a TxDot maintained roadway and consists of approximately 80' ROW and is classified as a regional connector/ arterial (ultimately the roadway should be designed to consist of 4 lanes at full build out)

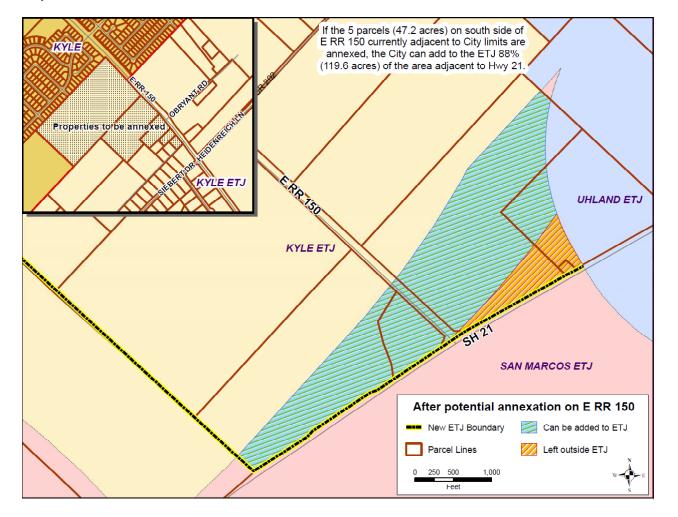
Comprehensive Plan

The Comprehensive Plan generally shows this area to be located within a regional node future land use district. A regional node is identified to be an area with regional scale retail and commercial activity and complemented by regional scale residential uses. Appropriate uses may include grocery stores, retail shopping centers, multi-family housing, and municipal services, such as libraries and recreation centers. The primary goal of a regional node is to capture commercial opportunities necessary to close the City's tax gap.



Extension of ETI

The annexation of the subject property would allow the City of Kyle's ETJ (Extraterritorial Jurisdiction) to extend out to Hwy 21 and RR 150, pending the release of the area from the San Marcos ETJ. While the City Council has identified a goal of annexing properties along



RR 150 all the way to Hwy 21 the first step to assure the properties are within the city's ETJ.

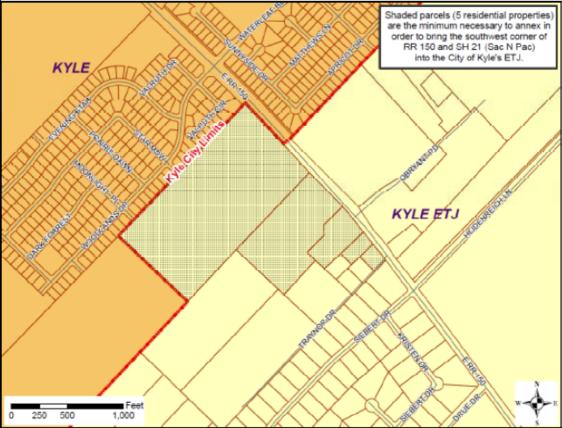
