CITIZEN COMMENT PERIOD WITH CITY COUNCIL

THE CITY COUNCIL WELCOMES COMMENTS FROM CITIZENS EARLY IN THE AGENDA OF REGULAR MEETINGS. THOSE WISHING TO SPEAK MUST SIGN IN BEFORE THE MEETING BEGINS AT THE KYLE CITY HALL. SPEAKERS MAY BE PROVIDED WITH AN OPPORTUNITY TO SPEAK DURING THIS TIME PERIOD, AND THEY MUST OBSERVE THE THREE-MINUTE TIME LIMIT.

Mayor Webster opened the Citizens Comments at 7:04 p.m. Guillermo Tenorio spoke and stated he was a senior in high school and had been in Mariachi since 6th grade and asked Council to support and fund the dia de los muertos event and that it was a community event that would continue to grow. Conner Matts spoke and asked the Council to fund the dia de los muertos event. He stated if they had to pay it, money would come out of their activity funds for students. Daphne Tenorio spoke and stated that when they started the event 3 years ago they had expected about 300 people but were surprised to see over 1500 in attendance to support the students. She stated this event was a funding source for the community and asked Council to support item #23. Natalia Tenorio spoke and stated she was speaking on item #23 and the waiving of the fees for the mariachi extravaganza. She stated that her brother played in mariachi band and had seen the event grow and invited all to attend. Tim Miller spoke and stated that he had been told that the Mayor was working on an urban farm ordinance and since there were no other urban farms other than his, he expected to be included in the process because he had much input due to his 23 years owning a farm and that he would be an asset developing an urban farm ordinance. Jerry Kolacny spoke about the new downtown revitalization being considered and perhaps under way, and wanted to speak about the development that has taken place. He stated he had seen CBD1 and CBD2 and that they had not give CBD2 a chance to see what it could do. He stated he was concerned about the future of the downtown area and they needed to do more to attract upscale homes and not bars and dance halls in the downtown area. James Rios spoke on Item # 25 for a dance hall in downtown Kyle to be include in CBD2, and stated he owned Centerfield Sports Bar and Grill downtown and with this dance hall wanted to provide something for the community and restoring the look of downtown. He stated he did not want to do anything negative and it would be run as a classy establishment. Sylvia Gallo spoke and stated she had spoken to Council before asking to keep 2 events dear to her. She stated they did not have the funds to keep the fajita fiesta here and took it to Buda that was a fabulous event. She was passed on when she

asked for funds to keep it here but wanted to now ask that Council fund the dia de los muertos event support the mariachi students and make it a yearly event for the community.

AGREEMENT FOR INVESTMENT ADVISORY SERVICES BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF KYLE, TEXAS AND FIRSTSOUTHWEST ASSET MANAGEMENT, INC.

This Investment Advisory Agreement (the "Agreement") is made by and between the City of Kyle, Texas (the "Investor") and FirstSouthwest Asset Management, Inc. ("FSAM"). This agreement shall be effective as of the date of its acceptance by the Investor as indicated on the signature page hereof.

I. Terms and Conditions

This Agreement sets forth the terms and conditions governing the relationship of the Investor to FSAM with respect to securities and money which the Investor holds, from time to time, and which are available for investment or reinvestment (the '**Portfolio**''). This Agreement shall apply to any and all investable funds and securities in the Investor's Portfolio during the period in which this Agreement shall be in effect.

II. Investment Advisory Services

- A. Services. With respect to the Portfolio, FSAM will endeavor to provide investment advisory services and cause to be executed such trades as determined in accordance with Section II.B below. FSAM agrees to provide professional services and its facilities and to direct and coordinate all programs of investing as may be considered and authorized by the Investor and to assume and pay those expenses incurred by FSAM in connection with the execution of investment decisions. Specifically, FSAM agrees to perform the following duties:
 - 1. Review the Investor's cash flow projections;
 - 2. Recommend appropriate strategies based upon cash flow requirements;
 - 3. Advise the Investor on current market conditions and other general information;
 - 4. Analyze risk/return relationships between various investment alternatives;
 - 5. Assist in the selection of investment securities and, as directed by the Investor, cause the transactions to be executed;
 - 6. Advise on the investment of the Portfolio in a manner consistent with the Investment Policy, the Texas Public Fund Investment Act (TPFIA), the proceedings of the Investor authorizing the investment of the funds and applicable state and federal rules and regulations;
 - 7. Promptly send (or cause to be sent) trade confirmations to the Investor; and
 - 8. Provide the Investor monthly, quarterly, and/or annual investment reports to include but not limited to the status of the investment portfolio, investments held in portfolio, earnings, all transactions and activities including purchase/sale of investments, redemptions, gains/losses, investment expenses, and other items as required under the investment policy, stated procedures and/or state law.
 - 9. Provide quarterly briefings to the governing body of the Investor at its 2nd regularly scheduled meeting following the end of each quarter on the investment portfolio, earnings, gains/losses, and investment expenses;

- 10. Within forty-five (45) days of the execution of this agreement and annually thereafter during the term of the agreement, FSAM will review, update and present a draft Investment Policy in compliance with TPFIA to the City Council for their consideration and approval. The Investment Policy must, at a minimum, include the types of investments that will be allowed, strategies for investment, preservation of principal, liquidity, collateral requirements, and compliance with the requirements of TPFIA.
- B. **Scope of Investment Decisions.** In performing the services listed in Section II.A above, FSAM shall not have discretionary authority and, accordingly, shall obtain approval from the Investor for the purchase or sale of securities prior to execution. The Investor hereby represents and acknowledges that its written investment policy and investment strategy includes its investment objectives and all portfolio limitations and restrictions, including, without limitation, acceptable levels of investment risk. The Investor also agrees to notify FSAM in writing ten business days in advance of the implementation of any changes in the Investor's investment objectives, investment limitations, and/or financial condition. Furthermore, the Investor will give FSAM immediate verbal notice and written notice within five days of receipt of any trade confirmations should the Investor believe that any investment in the Portfolio violates the Investor's investment objectives or limitations.
- C. **Standard of Care.** In the administration of its duties, FSAM shall exercise the judgment and care, under prevailing circumstances, that a prudent person would exercise in the management of the person's own affairs, not for speculation, but for investment, considering, with regard to the entire Portfolio rather than any particular investment or security, the probable safety of capital and the probable income to be derived.
- D. Settlement of Securities. The purchase of individual securities shall be executed "delivery versus payment" (DVP) through the Investor's safekeeping agent. By so doing, Investor's funds will be released when and if the Investor has received, through the safekeeping agent, the designated securities purchased.
- E. **Hold Harmless.** To the extent allow under the laws and Constitution of the State of Texas, the Investor hereby agrees to indemnify and hold harmless FSAM, as well as any of its officers, directors, shareholders, affiliates, general partners, employees, agents and trustees, from (i) charges incurred by FSAM on the Investor's behalf and (ii) for any and all market losses arising with respect to the Portfolio.
- F. **Return on the Portfolio.** The Investor expressly affirms and acknowledges that FSAM has not promised or guaranteed any stated or specified return on, or performance of, the Investor's investment portfolio.

III. Representations

- A. FSAM represents that it is registered as an investment advisor under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 (the "Advisers Act") and is authorized and empowered to enter into this Agreement.
- B. The Investor represents and confirms that (1) the Investor has full power and authority to enter into this agreement; (2) the terms hereof do not violate any obligation by which the Investor is bound, whether arising by contract, operation of law, or otherwise; and (3) this Agreement has been duly authorized and will be binding on Investor according to its terms.
- C. The Investor agrees to:
 - 1. Provide FSAM with the schedule of estimated cash flow requirements related to the Portfolio, and promptly notify FSAM as to any changes in such estimated cash flow schedule;
 - 2. Provide FSAM, not less than monthly, with all relevant custodian, safekeeping and bank statements relating to all of the Portfolio; and

- 3. Allow FSAM to rely upon all information regarding schedules or other information pertaining to the Portfolio as provided to it by the Investor as being true and accurate. FSAM shall have no responsibility to verify, through audit or investigation, the accuracy or completeness of such information and FSAM will not undertake to authenticate any such information.
- D. The Investor recognizes that there may be loss or depreciation of the current liquidation, immediate and ongoing value of any investment due to the fluctuation of market values. The Investor represents that no party to this Agreement has made any guarantee, either oral or written, that the Investor's investment objectives will be achieved. FSAM shall not be liable for any error in judgment and/or for any investment losses in the Portfolio in the absence of willful malfeasance, negligence, or violation of applicable law. Nothing in this Agreement shall constitute a waiver or limitation of any rights that the Investor may have under applicable state or federal law including without limitation, the state and federal securities laws.
- E. Investor represents and acknowledges that Investor has reviewed and understands the risk factors and fees associated with the Portfolio.

IV. Fees and Costs of FSAM

As consideration for the services provided by FSAM under this Agreement, FSAM will be entitled to a fee (the "Advisor Fee") determined in accordance with the schedule set forth in the fee schedule ("Schedule A"), a copy of which is attached hereto, is incorporated herein for all purposes and is being delivered to the Investor simultaneously with the execution, and as an integral part, of this Agreement. The obligation of FSAM to pay or incur expenses shall not include any costs incident to litigation, mandamus action, regulatory investigation, test case or other similar legal actions.

V. Reporting and Account Statements

FSAM will deliver or cause to be delivered to the Investor confirmation of transactions and monthly statements for the Portfolio as set forth in this Agreement. FSAM will also provide the Investor with a quarterly valuation of the Investor's Portfolio as setforth in Section IIA. and any additional statements that may be required by applicable law, including the reporting provisions of the Public Funds Investment Act, or other applicable state law, with respect to transactions effected under this Agreement.

VI. Other Services

The investment advisory services provided hereunder by FSAM to the Investor are exclusive of any other services that FSAM may provide to the Investor.

VII. Execution of Investment Transactions

- A. Affiliated Broker. FSAM is affiliated through common ownership and control with First Southwest Company ("FSC"), a registered broker/dealer with the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority. ("FINRA"), the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC"), and various state and territorial regulatory authorities. Investor hereby authorizes FSAM to effect transactions for the Portfolio by execution through FSC. Where transactions are effected through FSC, FSC may act on an agency or principal basis to the extent permitted by law. Pursuant to Rule 206(3) of the Advisers Act, FSAM will obtain the Investor's consent on each investment transaction to allow FSC to act as a principal in acquiring a security to facilitate a trade. Fees for advisory services will be billed separately in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.
- B. **Bundling of Investment Transactions.** Transactions for each Investor account generally will be effected independently unless FSAM decides to purchase or sell the same securities for several Investors at approximately the same time. FSAM may (but is not obligated to) combine or "batch" such orders to obtain best execution. Under this procedure, transactions will be averaged as to price

and will be allocated among FSAM's investors included in the "batch" group in proportion to the purchase and sale orders placed for each Investor in batch transactions.

VIII. Selection of Brokers

The Investor agrees that when FSAM effects or places orders for the execution of transactions for the Portfolio (other than situations where the Investor specifically instructs otherwise in writing), FSAM may allocate such transactions to such brokers and dealers for execution on such markets, at such prices as in the judgment of FSAM will be in the best interests of the Investor, taking into consideration, in the selection of such brokers and dealers, the available prices and rates of brokerage commissions and other relevant factors, without having to demonstrate that such factors are of a direct benefit to the Investor. Subject to the foregoing, FSAM will arrange for the execution of securities transactions for the Portfolio through brokers or dealers that FSAM reasonably believes will provide best execution.

IX. Non-Exclusive Relationship

The Investor hereby acknowledges that FSAM's services under this Agreement are nonexclusive, and that FSAM shall be free to render the same or similar services to other Investors. The Investor further acknowledges that FSAM's advice is specific to each individual Investor's investment objectives, limitations and financial condition. Therefore FSAM, in the performance of its investment advisory duties, may give advice to, and take action on behalf of, other Investors that may differ from the advice given, or the timing and nature of the action taken, with respect to the Investor's Portfolio. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to impose upon FSAM any obligation to purchase or sell, or to recommend for purchase or sale for the Investor's Portfolio, any security that FSAM or its affiliates may purchase or sell, for their own account or for the accounts of any other Investor if, at the sole discretion of FSAM, it is for any reason undesirable or impractical to take such action or make such recommendation for the Investor's Portfolio. The Investor also acknowledges that FSAM has varying fee structures and arrangements with other investors and may charge their investor's Portfolio for similar services.

X. Instructions from the Investor

FSAM may rely on all instructions (written only) given by the Investor or its agents that FSAM believes to be genuine. FSAM's records of such a transaction will be conclusive as to the content of any instruction. Instructions may be given to FSAM by any officer or agent authorized by (1) the investment policy; (2) a duly executed "Authorization to Trade Public Funds" form provided by FSAM; or (3) a resolution of the governing body of Investor. FSAM may rely on such authorization until written notice to the contrary is delivered to FSAM by the Investor; and if the Investor does not deliver appropriate authorizing documentation, FSAM may accept instructions from any person reasonably believed by FSAM to be an officer of the Investor. The Investor agrees to the extent allowd under the Texas Constitution and laws of the State of Texas to hold harmless, and to indemnify and defend, FSAM, as well as any of its officers, directors, shareholders, affiliates, general partners, employees, agents, and trustees, against any and all losses sustained by FSAM resulting from or by reason of any and all claims, liabilities, losses, damages, charges, costs, fees, and expenses (including, without limitation, attorneys fees and costs, including fees of attorneys who may be FSAM employees or employees of FSAM's affiliates) arising out of or in connection with any action taken in reliance upon any instruction or inquiry believed genuine.

XI. Transactions Subject to Industry Regulations and Standards

All transactions shall be subject to the regulations of all applicable government authorities and self-regulatory agencies including, but not limited to, the constitutions and rules of the clearing agent, exchange, or market where executed. The Investor understands that FSAM is registered as an investment advisor under the Advisers Act, and as such is obligated to comply with all applicable laws and regulations, including those of the SEC and other regulatory and self-regulatory agencies, and agrees that FSAM shall not be liable to the Investor as a result of any action taken by FSAM to comply with any ruling, interpretation, or directive of such organizations. Further, Investor understands and agrees that FSAM will not accept any instructions from Investor which would require a violation of any such rules or regulations.

XII. Assignment

Neither FSAM nor the Investor may assign any of its rights, authorizations, or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party.

XIII. Term and Investor's Right of Cancellation

This Agreement shall become effective November 1, 2014 and continue for a two (2) year period after which time this agreement may be renewed for three additional one-year periods unless otherwise notified in writing by either party sixty (60) calendar days before the beginning of each of the two additional one-year terms. Either party may terminate this Agreement upon delivering to the other party sixty (60) calendar days' prior written notice. In addition, the Investor may terminate this Agreement without penalty for a period of five (5) business days after the date it is executed by the Investor. The Investor may exercise this right by giving written notice to FSAM within the required time period. In the event of termination, it is understood and agreed that only the amounts due to FSAM for services provided and expenses incurred to and including the date of termination be due and payable. No penalty will be assessed for termination of this Agreement. In addition, the parties hereto agree that upon termination of this Agreement FSAM shall have no continuing obligation to the Investor regarding the investment of funds or performing any other services contemplated herein.

XIV. Custodial Arrangements

Custody of Portfolio assets will be maintained with a custodian (the "Custodian") approved by the Investor. The Custodian will be identified and recommended by FSAM. Investor will be solely responsible for paying all fees or charges of the Custodian. FSAM will not have custody of any assets in the Portfolio. Investor authorizes FSAM to give Custodian instructions for the purchase, sale, conversion, redemption, exchange or retention of any security, cash or cash equivalent or other investment for the Portfolio.

XV. Miscellaneous

- A. **Notices to the Investor.** All written communication to the Investor shall be sent to the Investor's address set forth on the signature page hereof or as directed in writing to FSAM by the Investor. Any notice, statement, or other communication mailed to the Investor by FSAM in accordance with this section will be deemed to be given to the Investor upon actual receipt by the Investor or three days after such is placed in the mail.
- B. **Notices to FSAM.** Any notice, statement, or other communication from the Investor to FSAM under this Agreement must be in written form and will be deemed to be given to FSAM upon actual receipt thereof by FSAM, whether such notice was mailed, personally delivered, or telecopied to:

- C. **Confidential Relationship.** All of the information and advice furnished by either party to the other under this Agreement, including their respective agents and employees, will be treated as strictly confidential by each party and will not be disclosed to third parties under any circumstances except as required by law including but not limited to Chapter 552 of the Texas Government Code.
- D. Limitations of Liability. Federal and state securities laws impose liabilities under certain circumstances on persons who do not act in good faith and, therefore, nothing in this Agreement shall in any way constitute a waiver or limitation of any rights that the Investor may have under federal and state securities laws.

- E. **Indemnity.** To the extent allowed under the laws and Constitution of the State of Texas, the Investor will indemnify FSAM for any loss, liability, or expense (including attorney's fees) which FSAM may incur as a result of, or arising from, any claims asserted by any third party with respect to the Portfolio or the services rendered by FSAM under this Agreement, except in cases of gross negligence or willful misconduct by FSAM in managing the Investor's Portfolio. In addition, FSAM will indemnify Investor for any loss, liability, or expense (including attorney's fees) which the Investor my incur as a result of, or arising from, any claims asserted by any third party with respect to the Portfolio or the services rendered by FSAM under this Agreement, except in cases of gross negligence or willful misconduct by the Investor in connection with the Investor's Portfolio.
- F. **Inconsistent Provisions; Agreements.** If any provisions of this Agreement should become or be found to be inconsistent with laws, rules, or regulations of any government or regulatory body having jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, such provisions shall be deemed modified or rescinded in accordance with any such laws, rules, or regulations. To the extent that the provisions of this Agreement are inconsistent with the provisions of any account agreement or clearing agreement with FSAM or its clearing agent, as the case may be, then the terms of such account agreement or clearing agreement shall govern and such terms shall supersede the inconsistent terms herein.
- G. **Invalid Provisions.** If any provision or condition of this Agreement shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable by any Court, or regulatory or self-regulatory agency or body, such invalidity or unenforceability shall attach only to such provision or condition. The validity of the remaining provisions and conditions shall not be affected, and this Agreement shall be carried out as if any such invalid or unenforceable provision or condition were not contained herein.
- H. **Waiver of Terms.** Either FSAM's or Investor's failure to insist at any time upon strict compliance with any terms of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of any rights as described herein.
- I. **Governing Law.** This Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, without regard to its principles of conflicts of laws.
- J. **Extraordinary Events.** Neither FSAM nor any of its officers, directors, shareholders, affiliates, general partners, employees, agents, or trustees shall be liable for losses caused directly or indirectly by government restrictions, exchange or market actions, suspensions of trading, wars, strikes, delays in the transmission of orders due to breakdown or failure of transmission or communication facilities, or any other causes beyond FSAM's reasonable control or anticipation.
- K. Written Disclosure Statement. Simultaneously with the execution of this Agreement, FSAM has delivered to the Investor Part II of its Form ADV as filed with the SEC, or a similar disclosure document, as its brochure pursuant to Rule 204.3 of the Advisers Act. The Investor's execution of this Agreement shall be deemed acknowledgment of receipt thereof.
- L. Verification of Information. The Investor represents and warrants to FSAM that all information furnished to FSAM in connection with the opening of the Portfolio (and all documents supplied by the Investor in this regard, including financial statements) are true, complete, and correct. FSAM is entitled to rely on this information until FSAM receives written notice of any change, which the Investor agrees to furnish promptly should any material changes occur.

Texas Public Funds Investment Act


- The Texas Public Funds Investment Act (PFIA) restricts the type of investments in which the City can invest its funds.
- Safety of principal is the highest priority, followed by liquidity, and finally yield.
- Allowable investment options include:
 - U.S. Government Obligations Treasury Bills, Notes, and Bonds
 - U.S. Government Agency Obligations debt issued by Fannie Mae, Freddie Mac, the Federal Home Loan Bank, and other government agencies
 - Top-tier, highly rated commercial paper
 - Certain municipal obligations
 - Certificates of Deposit, must be secured by FDIC insurance or pledged collateral
 - Local Government Investment Pools, Money Market Mutual Funds
- Familiar Investments that are <u>NOT</u> allowed by PFIA:
 - Stocks, Stock Mutual Funds, ETF's, Hedge Funds
 - Most bond mutual funds and ETFs
 - Real Estate



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Sample Yields for Allowable Investments

- The Federal Reserve has enacted an aggressive monetary policy in an effort to stimulate economic growth and reduce unemployment.
- The target fed funds rates, a key short-term borrowing rate, has been set at a range of 0%-0.25% since late 2008.
 This has kept short-term interest rates near zero. PFIA eligible money market funds yield 0.01% while local government investment pools (LGIPs) yield 0.03%. Six-month Treasury Bills yield just 0.05%.
- Two-year Treasury-notes yield 0.50% while two-year agencies yield 0.60%.
- So called quantitative easing has helped push longer term rates to historic lows. The 10year Treasury-note yields just 2.40%.
- Obviously, these are nowhere near the traditional 8-10% annual returns of a 401k or pension retirement plan.





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Current Portfolio Earnings

- Currently, all funds are invested in two local government investment pools (LGIPs) which offer yields barely above zero. TexPool and TexSTAR both yield about 0.035% today.
- Annual earnings on the City's \$35 million portfolio are less than \$15,000.



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Proposed Fees

- FSAM proposes to provide complete investment management services at a fixed cost of \$7,000 per quarter (\$28,000 per year). This equates to approximately 8 basis points (0.08%) on the City's \$35 million portfolio.

WHEREAS, the city council seeks to comply with the purpose, goal and intent of Chapter 245; and,

WHERAS, certain sections of the Code of Ordinances are not in compliance with Chapter 245 of the Texas Local Government Code, which establishes vested rights and is generically called the "Vested Rights Statute"; and,

WHEREAS, Chapter 245 of the Texas Local Government Code provides specific periods as to when certain stages of development projects lapse or expire, which said periods are in conflict with certain sections of the Code of Ordinances; and,

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the city council to amend or repeal those sections_in order to have said sections in compliance with Chapter 245 of the Local Government Code; and,

WHEREAS, it is the city council's further intent to amend said sections_to include certain exclusions to the expiration requirements of Chapter 245 of the Local Government Code; and,

WHEREAS, city council further intends to amend certain of said sections to include definitions for the purpose of clarifying the application and interpretation of said amended sections;

Words used in the present tense include the future tense. Words used in the plural number include the singular, and words in the singular include the plural. The word "shall" is always mandatory. Notice shall be considered adequate if sent to the applicant by certified mail, return receipt requested, at the applicant's last known address provided by the applicant."

Section 5. <u>Amendment to Sec. 53-954</u>.

Sec. 53-954 ("Expiration") of Chapter 53, Article IV (Plan Requirements and Special Provisions) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Kyle, shall be amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 53-954. - Expiration.

Unless a longer time shall be specifically established as a condition of approval, construction plan approval shall expire no earlier than September 1, 2010, and no earlier than two years for an individual construction plan and no earlier than five years for a project following the date on which such approval became effective, unless prior to the expiration, a building permit is issued and construction is commenced and diligently pursued toward completion.

WHEREAS, the City has experienced rapid growth but a lack of diversity of housing design; and,

Section 2. <u>Purpose of Amendment</u>. The City of Kyle Code of Ordinances is hereby amended insofar, and only insofar, as is herein set forth and in no other respect whatsoever.

Section 3. Amendment of Chapter 53, Article I, Section 53-5 Definitions.

Sec. 53-5 ("Definitions") of Chapter 53, Article I of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Kyle, shall be amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 53-5. Definitions.

Front property line means the boundary of a parcel that is generally located immediately adjacent to a public street a structure faces. In the case of side lots that have two boundaries adjacent to public streets, the front property line shall be toward the street that will be used for 9-1-1 address purposes.

Front wall means the wall that generally faces the front property line, or in the case of side lots that have two boundaries adjacent to public streets, the front wall shall be the wall where the front entrance to the structure on the parcel is located.

Wall means a structure of brick, stone, or other suitable building material, that is a side of a building, surrounds an area, separates one area from another, defines an area architecturally, or carries a load."

Section 4. <u>Incorporation of Standards</u>. The "Standards for Determining of a Front Wall for the Purposes of Establishing Garage Setback" as recommended by the city's planning and zoning commission are attached as EXHIBIT "A" and incorporated herein by reference to said Exhibit.

Section 4. <u>Severability</u>. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid for any purpose, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected thereby and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are declared to be severable.

Section 5. <u>Conflicting Ordinances</u>. All ordinances or parts thereof conflicting or inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance as adopted and amended herein, are hereby amended to the extent of such conflict. In the event of a conflict or inconsistency between this ordinance and any other code or ordinance of the City, the terms and provisions of this ordinance shall govern.

Section 6. <u>Open Meetings</u>. EXHIBIT "A"

STANDARDS FOR DETERMINATION OF A FRONT WALL FOR THE PURPOSES OF ESTABLISHING GARAGE SETBACK

<u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of this recommendation is to provide standards ("Standards") for city staff to use in making a determination of what constitutes a front wall ("front wall").

<u>Commission goal</u>. It is the goal of the Planning and Zoning Commission ("Commission") that home front elevations not be dominated by front facing garages, nor by protruding front facing garages. However, it is also the desire of the Commission to empower city staff to make determinations as to what is and is not acceptable to be qualified as a front wall. To help facilitate such determinations, the following general guidelines and procedures are hereby adopted for city staff to refer to as a guide in making such determinations.

<u>Standards</u>. The following Standards are recommended to be referred to by city staff when determining what qualifies as a front wall:

- 1) Require diversity of housing design in Kyle whereby a garage shall not dominate the front elevation, either by the percentage of front elevation determined by width or by protrusion toward a front property line. A garage shall violate this requirement if it is more than 50% of the front width of the home, or if it is set back less than five feet from the front wall.
- 2) The front wall is the forward, most-enclosed outer wall of a structure that faces the front property line.
- 3) A designation of front wall can be given to a load-bearing wall that defines an area. This designation does not require the front wall to be fully enclosed, but it shall dominate the non-garage portion of the front elevation, such as the load-bearing portion of a covered front porch, or the load bearing portion of a front porch where there is a covered balcony overhead. Final determination of what does and does not constitute the designation of front wall shall be determined by the planning director ("director") or designee.
 - a. In order to qualify for this designation, a builder or developer ("Builder") must submit a master set of color elevation plans along with the accompanying floor plans for the homes to be built within a subdivision where this designation is being requested.
 - b. The master set of elevations and floor plans will be reviewed by the Director or designee, and each elevation and floor plan will be considered for approval by the Director or designee. After an elevation and floor plan receives said approval from the Director or designee, the master set shall

govern the elevation and plans that have received the designation of front wall for a wall other than a standard fully enclosed outer most wall.

- 4) If a garage is determined by the Director or designee to be set back a minimum of five feet from either a front wall or a designated front wall as provided for herein, the set back shall be in compliance with the requirements of applicable provisions of the city's Code of Ordinances and in accordance with this policy.
- 5) If a Builder disagrees with the determination of the Director or designee, the determination may be appealed to the Commission for a determination.


The first reading of the proposed amending ordinance was held by Council at the October 8, 2014 meeting.




 Width of Garage Wall must be less than the width of the Front Wall







PARTIAL FIRST FLOOR PLAN 'D' - 4 SCALE (10"=1-0" (TYP)


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

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sec. 53-34(a) of the Code of Ordinances, the city is divided into 24 zoning districts, including central business district 2 (District CBD-2); and,

Dance hall means a business establishment that otherwise complies with Chapter 53 (Zoning) of the Code of Ordinances and provides floor space for dancing; provides live music performances or prerecorded music or both and may impose a cover charge for entry to the dance hall; may sell alcoholic beverages but only pursuant to and in accordance with a license or permit issued by the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission lawfully held by the owner or operator of the dance hall; and may sell or otherwise provide food but only in accordance with applicable public health and other laws."

Section 4. <u>License requirement and regulations by council</u>. The city council may by ordinance subsequent to the passage of this ordinance adopt a license requirement and other regulations governing dance halls. If said license requirement or regulations are inconsistent or in conflict with any ordinance, including this ordinance, order, resolution or other official action taken by the city council, the adopted license requirement and regulations shall govern dance halls from the effective date of said license requirement and regulations.

Section 5. <u>Amendment of Chapter 53, Article II, Section 53-1230</u>. EXHIBIT A of Sec. 53-1230 (Uses Permitted in Certain Districts) of Chapter 53, Article II (Zoning Districts and Regulations), Division 15 (Central Business District 2, District CBD-2) of the Code of Ordinances shall be amended to include the following:

NAICS Code: 722410 (Alcohol beverage drinking places) SIC Type: Retail SIC Code Description: Dance Hall Primary Zoning: CBD-2 Secondary Zoning: RS Third Zoning: W Fourth Zoning: CM/E.

Section 6. <u>Compliance with IBC</u>; owner responsibility</u>. The owner, operator, manager, employee with management responsibilities, or any other person responsible, temporarily or otherwise, for the operation of an establishment operated as a dance hall as defined by this ordinance shall comply with the International Building Code (IBC), Chapter 3 (Use and Occupancy Classification) Section 303 (Assembly Group A), A-2: Assembly uses intended for food and/or drink consumption. Notwithstanding an owner, operator, manager, employee with management responsibilities, or any other person responsible, temporarily or otherwise, for the operation of a dance hall refuses or fails to comply with said IBC provision, the owner shall be held responsible and liable for said noncompliance.

Section 7. <u>Compliance with Code of Ordinances; owner responsibility</u>. The owner, operator, manager, employee with management responsibilities, or any other person responsible, temporarily or otherwise, for the operation of an establishment operated as a dance hall as defined by this ordinance shall comply with Chapter 53 (Zoning) of the Code of Ordinances and in particular, Secs. 53-443 through 53-479 of said Chapter. Notwithstanding an owner, operator, manager, employee with management responsibilities, or any other person responsible, temporarily or otherwise, for the operation of a dance hall refuses or fails to comply with said Code or particular section or sections, the owner shall be held responsible and liable for said noncompliance.

Section 8. <u>Number of parking spaces required</u>. The number of parking spaces required for a dance hall shall be determined and governed by Sec. 53-33 of Chapter 53 (Zoning) of the Code of Ordinances. The city council may adopt an ordinance subsequent to this ordinance that governs parking space requirements of dance halls.

Section 9. <u>Penalty</u>. A violation of this ordinance shall be a Class C misdemeanor and the penalty for violating this ordinance shall be as provided for in Sec. 1-14 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Kyle, Texas, which shall be a fine of not less than \$1.00 and no more than \$2,000.00, and each day a violation exists shall be a separate offense.

Section 10. <u>Civil remedies</u>. The city may seek any and all civil remedies allowed under law in a court of competent jurisdiction for any violation of this ordinance, including but not limited to injunction, declaratory judgment, damages and reasonable attorney's fees. 







This letter is to explain our understanding of the arrangements for consulting services Padgett, Stratemann & Co., L.L.P. ("PS&Co.") is to perform for the City of Kyle (the "City"). We ask that you either confirm or amend this understanding.

Scope of Services and Deliverables

The scope of our services will focus on assisting the City with reviewing documents and accounting records and the preparation of a reassessment roll for the Bunton Creek Public Improvement District (the "PID").

Our procedures will include the following:

- 5. Obtain from the City and review a letter from QUALICO to Ken Johnson dated May 19, 2014.
- 6. Obtain from the City and examine a schedule titled Bunton Creek, Detail Job Cost Report Total Costs to Date as of April 23, 2014.
- 7. Obtain from the City and examine a plat map of the Bunton Creek development area prepared by Carlson, Brigance & Doering, Inc.

- 8. Obtain from the City and review a listing of all lots contained within the PID boundaries.

 - a. Meet with the City Engineer and/or City Attorney and review both cost schedules and confirm, based on the description provided, whether either schedule contains any cost types that are not allowable under state laws or regulations for PID assessments.
- 10. Using the Exhibit C to the City of Kyle Ordinance No. 469, compare the lot and block designations to the plat map of the Bunton Creek development area obtained in procedure 7.

Our procedures will be limited to those described in this letter as modified by any subsequent agreement. This engagement is not an audit or attestation engagement; therefore, we will not perform any procedures to verify the accuracy of any records or examine any source documents, except to the extent necessary as a part of the procedures described previously. 


