

   Creek









#### FEEDBACK ON CONCEPTS

### CENTRAL PARK FEEDBACK

- Generally favored Concept 3, particularly the location of the stage, water feature in front of the stage, and the large play area
- Pull in the water feature elements and rain garden from Concept 1
- Maximize the lawn space
- Minimize impervious coverage
- Maximize variety of uses for the community
- Be mindful of creating environments for harmful critters as the design advances
- Allow for art to be integrated into the park
- Ensure playground is inclusive
- Avoid projecting noise toward Heroes Memorial from stage
- Integrate native and adaptive plantings of Concept 2
- Consider water play for a part of the playground similar to Concept 2

### CULTURAL TRAIL FEEDBACK

- Concept of a Cultural Trail ranked very high in importance
- Ensure strong connection to Heroes Memorial
- Consider planting opportunities to enhance the streetscape (e.g. planters)
- Incorporate elements of art and water to link
   Central Park and Heroes Memorial




# GOALS & STRATEGIES



#### 1. CENTRAL PARK AND CULTURAL TRAIL ARE INTEGRATED INTO THE CITY OF KYLE.

- 1.1 The Cultural Trail enhances already approved street sections for the Uptown development.
- 1.2 Access points and views, connecting the Central Park, Cultural Trail, and Heroes Memorial are celebrated and distinct.
- 1.3 The Central Park provides a wide range of amenities unique to the city, making it a destination for visitors in and outside Kyle.
- 1.4 The Central Park features a rain garden which functions as green infrastructure and contributes to the City's initiative for stormwater resilience.
- 1.5 The Central Park fulfills the needs identified in the City Park and Open Space Plan.









- 2. CENTRAL PARK AND CULTURAL TRAIL IS COMFORTABLE, ACCESSIBLE, AND INVITING FOR ALL.
  - 2.1 The Cultural Trail features attractive materials and planting creating a high-quality experience.
  - 2.2 The Cultural Trail includes accent and safe lighting levels to ensure that it is a safe experience for all visitors.
  - 2.3 The Cultural Trail will follow NACTO design guidelines.
  - 2.4 All pedestrian intersections along the Cultural Trail feature a raised table to slow vehicular traffic and increase safety for pedestrians.
  - 2.5 The Central Park and Cultural Trail incorporate significant amounts of shade to contribute to human comfort.
  - 2.6 The Central Park features clear circulation to all programmed areas with accessible routes.
  - 2.7 All entrances to the Central Park are carefully laid out providing direct access and overall porosity into the site without compromising a sense of place and enclosure.









- 3. CENTRAL PARK AND CULTURAL TRAIL ARE DESIGNED TO SUPPORT KYLE'S GROWING POPULATION.
  - 3.1 The Cultural Trail provides clear multimodal circulation to and from destination landmarks in Kyle.
  - 3.2 The size of the Central Park and its programmed areas have considered planned growth of Plum Creek and the surrounding area.
  - 3.3 Aspirational benchmarks or comparable projects in bigger communities have been used for inspiration so the Kyle can anticipate the needs of their growing population.
  - 3.4 The Central Park stage and lawn is sized to accommodate crowds of 2,245 people. Combined with the PAC and the future conference hotel, this area can accommodate larger crowds than anywhere else in Kyle.










- 4. CONSTRUCTION AND OPERATION OF THE CENTRAL PARK AND CULTURAL TRAIL ARE FINANCIALLY VIABLE INVESTMENTS.
  - 4.1 The design team has prepared initial opinions of probable cost that correlate to the TIRZ Strategic Framework Master Plan and Financial Plan.
  - 4.2 Materials will be durable to maximize lifecycle.
  - 4.3 The amenities in the Central Park are located strategically to to be compatible with adjacent land uses and vision for the district.
  - 4.4 The stage location in the Central Park provides the best orientation for viewers and orients noise away from surrounding residential neighbors and the Heroes Memorial.
  - 4.5 Programming of the Central Park considered the opportunity for revenue generating events.









- 5. CENTRAL PARK AND CULTURAL TRAIL WILL ENERGIZE THE AREA WITH DISTINCT DESIGN, ART, AND INTERPRETATION THAT CELEBRATES KYLE.
  - 5.1 The Cultural Trail is inspired by and will include interpretive elements about the history and culture of Kyle (railroad elements, auction oak and native stone).
  - 5.2 The Central Park and Cultural Trail will include an art plan that identifies multiple opportunities for integrating art by local artists and supports the physical and performance arts.
  - 5.3 The Central Park and Cultural Trail will accommodate events that help celebrate the people of Kyle and events important to the community.
  - 5.4 The theme of the Central Park is inspired by the geological profile of the region and carefully woven into the design fabric of the park.









- 6. CENTRAL PARK AND CULTURAL TRAIL CONTRIBUTE TO A VIBRANT BUSINESS ENVIRONMENT.
  - 6.1 The Cultural Trail ties directly into and informs the main retail street which features a variety of businesses.
  - 6.2 The Cultural Trail will provide a perfect parade route that connects the Heroes Memorial and the Central Park and provides vitality for adjacent retail uses.
  - 6.3 The Central Park provides various seating and casual gathering opportunities that are accessible and adjacent to complementary land uses.
  - 6.4 The Central Park includes opportunities for events such as performances, movies in the park and markets that will bring visitors to the area to support surrounding businesses.









- 7. CENTRAL PARK AND CULTURAL TRAIL PROGRAMMING SERVICES ALL DEMOGRAPHICS FROM THE COMMUNITY AND REGION.
  - 7.1 The Cultural Trail is designed to be versatile for a variety of events and temporary art installations.
  - 7.2 The Central Park provides a range of amenities for all ages youth to seniors.
  - 7.3 The Central Park provides programming for individuals and groups of various sizes.
  - 7.4 The Central Park provides a wide variety of program areas to appeal to broad group of users.
  - 7.5 The inclusive playground area in the Central Park is designed for children of multiple age groups and abilities to foster creative play for all.








