Re: Budget Workshop: Police Department Trends and Comparisons

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide you and Council a brief report comparing key statistical data of the Kyle Police Department with similar data provided by our Central Texas area benchmark comparison cities. These cities include; Cedar Park, Georgetown, New Braunfels, Pflugerville, San Marcos, Schertz, Seguin and Universal City.

The information contained in this report was secured from Kyle Police Department records, and information that was reported to the State of Texas by each of these comparison cities.

As you will note, the crime, staffing and budget comparisons for these cities are based upon the most recently published year end report for 2006. The 2007 report is expected to be published and distributed within the next four to six weeks.

It is hoped that you and the City Council find this information to be beneficial in assessing police services, select statistical trends, and the proposed FY2008/2009 budget.

In your review of the material, you will observe that the City of Kyle has been a good steward in the management of public funds. The report will also reflect that Kyle has maintained a commendably low crime rate considering its explosive growth and that the city has strived to maintain a prudent and conservative approach in managing police resources.

As we have previously discussed, I have found the police department's current CAD and RMS system to be unreliable and significant statistical variances exist between our computerized records and actual physical report counts. These two sets of figures will be identified/illustrated in the charts and graphs contained in this report, and also within the associated PowerPoint presentation. According to preliminary dialogue with the vendor, we appear to have corrupt tables in the software. As a point of illustration, the significant decline in reported crime for 2006 over 2005 figures happens to coincide with the installation of a major software update of that same year.

That being said, a distinct possibility exists that the police department has been underreporting crime in recent years.




