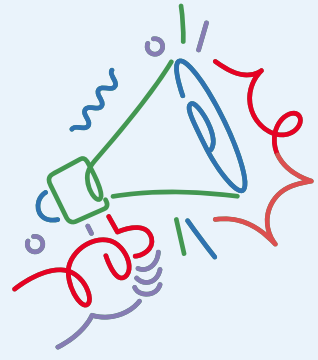

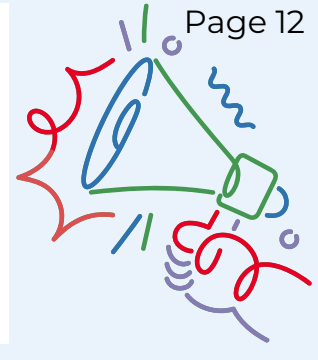

Re: Akin's Report of Activity for January 2024

Throughout January, Congress continued the fiscal year 2024 appropriations process while gearing up for the next year's efforts. Moreover, we worked with congressional staff, administration officials, and federal agencies to schedule meetings on behalf of the City ahead of their March visit to Washington, DC.

Congressional Updates

FY 24 Appropriations Process

The House and Senate are in the process of drafting consensus fiscal year 2024 appropriations bills after passing another continuing resolution (CR), which extends funding for certain federal agencies until March 1 and others until March 8. To that end, Senate Appropriations Committee Chair Patty Murray (D-WA) and House Appropriations Committee Chair Kay Granger (R-TX) announced they struck a deal on the top-line numbers for all twelve appropriations bills. This agreement will kick off appropriations discussions in earnest with the objective of drafting and passing appropriations bills by the March 1 and March 8 deadlines. We expect the final bills to include earmarks, however, we do not know whether the final bills will include all earmarks included in either the House or Senate bills or whether the final bill will reduce funding for some or all of the earmarks.

FY 25 Appropriations Process

President Biden announced that the fiscal year 2025 budget proposal to Congress will be released on March 11th. This will kick off the fiscal year 2025 appropriations process. The House and Senate Appropriations Committees have not yet released guidance for fiscal year 2025 community projects. Rep. Greg Casar's (D-TX) forms have yet to be released, but Akin will continue to track the appropriations process.

Given how the fiscal year appropriations process has lingered on, many on Capitol Hill anticipate a similar timeline for fiscal year 2025. Congress typically recesses early in a presidential election year meaning that there is a strong likelihood that 2024 will close out under a continuing resolution and it will be up to the new Congress to complete work on fiscal year 2025 appropriations bills.

Agency Updates

U.S. Department of Energy

On January 18, the Department of Energy (DOE) [announced](#) \$20.5 million in federal funds to 32 states and local governments through the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant program. The awarded projects include electric bicycle incentives, home solarization for low-income families, fleet electrification, decarbonization waste management strategies, and energy audits of municipal buildings.

U.S. Department of Transportation

The Department of Transportation (DOT) updated its schedule for various funding opportunities in the *Bipartisan Infrastructure Law* ([P.L. 117-58](#)) of which there remain two additional years of funding. The programs will roll out as follows:

- February – Safe Streets and Roads for All; Bus and Bus Facilities; Lo-No Emission Bus Program; Low Carbon Transportation Materials; Port Infrastructure Development Program, and Active Transportation Infrastructure Investment Program.
- March – Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvements (CRISI); Low Emitting (Ferry) Pilot Program and Passenger Ferry Grant Program, and Transit Oriented Development Planning.
- April – Federal-State Intercity Passenger Rail Program.
- Late Spring/Early Summer – Strengthening Mobility and Revolutionizing Transportation (SMART); Railroad Crossing Elimination, and Culvert Removal, Replacement & Restoration.

On January 18, the DOT [awarded](#) almost \$150 million in funds from the Electric Vehicle (EV) Charter Reliability and Accessibility Accelerator Program. The North Central Texas Council of Government received nearly \$3.6 million to improve the reliability of almost 197 ports.

On January 11, the DOT [awarded](#) approximately \$622.57 million in Charging and Fueling Infrastructure Program funds. The grant funding seeks to assist in the strategic deployment of publicly accessible EV charging and alternative fuel infrastructure. Notably, the following Texas applicants received funds:

- North Central Texas Council of Governments - \$70 million for the Charging and Fueling Infrastructure (CFI) Corridor Program for the Texas Hydrogen and Electric Freight Infrastructure Project.

- North Central Texas Council of Governments - \$15 million for the Charging and Fueling Infrastructure Community Program to Implement the North Texas Equitable Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Project.
- City of El Paso - \$15 million for the El Paso EV Charging Infrastructure Program: Phase I Project.

Department of Housing and Urban Development

On January 10, the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) issued a notice of funding opportunity to revise the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and Section 108 loan guarantee program regulations to make it easier for recipients to promote economic development and recovery in low- and moderate-income communities and support investments in underserved areas. Comments are due by March 11.

Department of Justice

On January 31, the Department of Justice's (DOJ) Office of Violence Against Women [issued](#) a notice of funding opportunity for Local Law Enforcement Grants for Enforcement of Cybercrimes Program. The award ceiling is \$500,000 and applications are due by March 19, 2024.
